### FELLOWSHIP HALL SUNDAY SCHOOL



The summary financial statement through March is presented above. Revenues at the end of the quarter were ahead of budget by \$49,156. This is due to the fact that the annually allowed earnings were distributed from the Endowment Fund in March. The total was \$34,888 which was split 50/50 between the operating budget and the building improvement fund. Also, we have a number of members who have already fulfilled their pledged amount for 2022. The church's expenses were below budget as of March 31 primarily due to the fact that the pastor position was vacant during the quarter.
