PCM has secured over half of the funding necessary to create their 48 bed emergency shelter and expand the client choice food pantry. Renovations will begin by the end of the year with an anticipated opening of the new facilities by June 2026. This will be the only year round nightly drop in shelter for men, women, and families in McCracken County. PCM is deeply grateful for the incredible community support for this project. Thank you!
