The summary financial operating statement for the first seven months of 2025 is presented above. Income was higher than expenses by \$60,494 as of 7/31/2025. This is primarily explained by the facts that we have not been fully staffed (\$18,727 under budget for church staff), and that many of the members who pledged gave a large portion of their pledge during the first seven months (\$16,585 ahead of budget for income). Mission Opportunity-Nigerian Water Project

It's been 13 years since First Presbyterian Paducah sent a mission team to Kenya to install two water systems with the House of Hope clinics in Katito and Kandaria.

In August, Session endorsed a water mission project in Nigeria. The **Nigerian** Water Project will be a Rotary Global Grant project that will partner our church with Rotary, the Presbytery of Western Kentucky, and Living Waters for the World (LWW). Key to this project will be the family connections among all three partners. Our own Charity Gar will be leading the education portion of the project. Her brother, Joseph Gar, is a Rotarian with the Paducah Rotary Club. He and Ralph Young will be working on the Rotary Global Grant. Charity and Joseph's nephew, Benjamin Gar, is the president of the Rotary Club of Makurdi in the Benue State of Nigeria. Benjamin will be representing his club on the project.

We are still in the fundraising stage of this \$60,000 project. The Presbytery has pledged \$2,500 and First Presbyterian Paducah has \$4,879 in their LWW account. We need an estimated \$2,621 more to fund the church's part of the project.
