Siblings in Christ,

In the early 2000s, Verizon Wireless promoted its business with a memorable commercial and tagline. In the ad, a man tests cell service in various environments – in a manhole in Chinatown, swampy backlands of the bayou, surrounded by busy office cubicles, in the midwestern cornfields, the hot desert, frigid tundra, and rolling mountains. He had only one line in the whole commercial:

"Can you hear me now? Good."

The clever message of Verizon was clear, literally. It showed that wherever one might go, they'd always have service. They'd always be connected.

How are you connected?

This question probably has many answers. It's almost impossible not to be connected with the abundance of advanced technology. What about outside of social media, desired news outlets, NYT games, and constant text messages? In what spaces do you find real connections with other people?

I hope that First Presbyterian Church is one of those places. I pray that you feel welcome within the walls of this church and in the ministries of its people. Like you belong. There is space for everyone in this community.

Believing this to be true, a new connectional opportunity will begin at the church this Fall. As of now, they're called "Family Groups," and they are exactly that – groups of families, big and small, that will spend time together.

The groups will meet individually once a month, for six months, for dinner, coffee, lunch, or during the Sunday School hour for fellowship and conversation topics provided by the church. They will provide spaces for people to be seen, heard, and find support through various life stages. Most importantly, the groups will reveal God at work in the life of the community. "God, can you hear us now?" we'll continue to ask, and the community will help us see that God does. And it will be good.

More to come on this exciting venture. As always, it's a joy to worship, serve, and learn alongside you.

Koinonia (Fellowship) Class

TIME

Time is an interesting thing. When we think of time we usually place something in the past, present, or future. Another way we use time is in our seasons. There is Winter, Spring, Summer, and Fall.

In the Greek language we also find events being described as occurring in "punctiliar" or "linear" time. Punctiliar means that something happened at once. Such as when Jesus healed the blind man. The man was blind and then in a moment, he could see. He was healed immediately. Linear happens over a period of time. This is shown when Jesus walked on the water. He began walking and then he continued walking. It was not instantaneous but continuous.

As Presbyterians we also have religious seasons.

First we have Advent. Advent is a four-week period in which the church not only looks forward to the birth and incarnation of Jesus Christ, but also to his return. This season is observed for the first four Sundays prior to Christmas.

Next is Christmas. Christmas is the festival of the birth of Christ and the celebration of God's coming among us as a human being. The Christmas season begins on Christmas Eve and ends with Epiphany (January 6).

We have something that we call ordinary time which is followed by Lent. Lent is a season of forty weekdays and six Sundays, beginning on Ash Wednesday and culminating in Holy Week. In this season, the church remembers and contemplates the atoning death of Jesus.

Holy Week, the last week of the Lenten season, relives Jesus' final week in Jerusalem, from his triumphal entrance into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday), to his last meal with his disciples (Maundy Thursday), to his actual crucifixion (Good Friday).

Then there is Easter. Easter is a fifty-day season consisting of seven Sundays, beginning with Easter Sunday (marking Jesus' resurrection) and ending with Pentecost (the birth of the church through the gift of the Holy Spirit to Christians). The focus of this season is the hope of new life that we have now that God has defeated the power of sin and death through the resurrection of Jesus.

We follow that with Ordinary Time 2. This second period of Ordinary Time begins on the Sunday following Pentecost and lasts until the new liturgical year begins on the first Sunday of Advent (the Sunday closest to November 30). Unlike the first period, this second period does contain some special observances, including Trinity Sunday and All Saints' Day.

Our literature is also divided into three sections so that we can find ourselves in Year A, Year B, or Year C.

This keeps us from getting into a rut. We seem to be always either in a special season, going into a season, or coming out of a season. Life is filled with special days. As Christians we can call them Holy Days. The secular world has modified that to Holidays.

This summer we are not taking time out even though it might seem like that. We are adjusting our thought framework. We may be leaving the "wet" of spring and entering the "dry" of summer.

Summer might be a time to rest or a time to work. Whatever it is for you, let us stay in touch with Bible study and worship. We know that for God, time is irrelevant. God is the God of past, present, and future as well as God of Spring, Summer, Fall, and Winter.

May God bless you, your family, and your friends.

Thank you God for the recent attendance in worship. I was glad when they said unto me, let us go into the house of the Lord.

Paducah Cooperative Ministry has kicked off their Share a New Start capital campaign!

PCM is launching a 50-bed emergency shelter – the first and only in Paducah and McCracken County – to provide a secure refuge for our neighbors experiencing homelessness. The facility will offer personal storage, shower facilities, nourishing meals, and tailored support from trained community health workers. By partnering with local agencies and community organizations, the shelter will connect guests with essential resources to address the root causes of homelessness.

PCM's food pantry is relocating to a larger facility at 425 Legion Drive, enabling us to implement a client-choice model that reimagines the tradtional pantry experience. In this model, guests shop like they would in a grocery store – selecting groceries that meet their unique dietary needs, cultural preferences, and household sizes. This approach empowers individuals and families to choose what they need while also reducing food waste.
