- Using a risk-based decision-making process with input from all relevant stakeholders.
- Providing ongoing education and training to all employees to ensure that all employees can • undertake their duties in a safe manner.
- Consulting with employees and other parties to improve decision-making on HSE matters. •
- Safe behaviour being a condition of employment. •
- Ensuring all HSE incidents are investigated and lessons are learnt within the Company. •
- Conducting regular HSE audits to evaluate compliance with HSE laws and the Company HSE policy. •
- Distributing HSE information, including this policy, to all employees and interested parties. •
- Providing enough resources to allow safe HSE practice as a central part of our organisation. •
- Providing effective injury management and rehabilitation to all employees. •
- All employees, contractors and sub-consultants being empowered to utilise the above strategies, including stop-work authority as required.
