TIMING RULES

WARMUP PITCHES

(6-2-2 EXC)

- New pitchers (starters in the first inning and new relievers)
 - 8 throws in ONE MINUTE, timed from the first throw
- Returning pitchers (starter or reliever)
 - 5 throws in ONE MINUTE, timed from the last out
- "PITCH CLOCK"
 - The pitcher must pitch or attempt a play within 20 SECONDS of receiving the ball
 PENALTY- BALL (6-2-2-c)
 - The batter must be ready within 20 seconds after the pitcher has received the ball
 PENALTY- STRIKE (7-3-1)

RULES-BASED VIDEOS (click links to view)

There are 2 components to a catch:

FIRM AND SECURE POSSESSION

It is not firm and secure possession if the ball comes out involuntarily.

No catch!

AND CONTINUING ACTION COMPLETED

Continuing action is usually by the fielder reaching into the glove, thus demonstrating voluntary release.

Not of his own doing, but this fielder did not complete the play.

Safe at first!






MECHANICS CORNER

PLATE UMPIRE MOVEMENTS FLY BALLS TO RIGHT WITH NO RUNNERS ON BASE

- > With no runners on base, there 2 umpires and 2 prime elements to cover:
 - The batter-runner and the baseball
- > P must come out from the plate in the direction of the ball on ALL fly balls.
- > U1 decides fly ball coverage and will go out on trouble balls in his area
 - 1- If U1 takes the runner (COMES IN), P has responsibility of the catch
 - 2- If U1 takes the ball (GOES OUT), P has the runner at all bases.

- 0:36 Excellent job by P
- 0:54 U1 out, P still in the dirt, That's a big problem if no catch.
- 1:12 U1 out, P takes BR into third base on a triple.

- 3. The head coach has been complaining about the officiating for most of the game. In the sixth inning, the base umpire has had enough and ejects the coach. Is this legal?
 - a. Yes, a coach may be ejected at any time for violations of 3-3-1
 - b. No, the warning may be verbal or written. The umpire should have given the offending coach a verbal warning at the time of the offense, then if he continues the behavior, the umpire can decide to issue a written warning and restriction, or ejection if the misbehavior is severe enough.

Most important rule for umpires is always "BE IN POSITION TO SEE EVERY PLAY." Even though your decision may be 100% right, players still question it if they feel you were not in a spot to see the play clearly and definitely.
