2025 RULES CHANGES



This is a very light year for rule changes:

<u>Rule 1-3-2-c-1</u> (Non-wood bats)

Modified to read that resin, pine tar, or other drying agent is allowed, as long as it does not extend beyond 18 inches from the base of the knob.

**In NFHS: extended pine tar, etc IS CAUSE FOR AN OUT for an illegal bat, as opposed to other rule sets (i.e. George Brett). See Case Book Situation 1.3.5.A

Rule 4-4-1 (Forfeits)

Modified to read that a game may be forfeited if a coach or team personnel is not removed in a timely manner after being disqualified by an umpire.

THAT'S INTERFERENCE!

- > This is an easy batter interference call.
- This is strike 3; the batter and runner will both be called out.
- If there were other runners, they go back to their Time Of Pitch base. Rules 7-3-5 PENALTY

UMPIRE INTERFERENCE

- It happens. Call it and move on. You cannot no-call this, as it put the defense at a disadvantage.
- Delayed dead ball: If the runner is retired, continue without reference to the interference.
- If the INITIAL THROW does not retire the runner call "TIME!" and send the runner back Rule 8-3-6




Not a lodged ball. The ball became dead when the batter was hit by the pitch. Runners advance only if forced.

MANAGING COACHES DISCUSSIONS: PROPER POSITIONS





Once the game has started, there are only two accepted positions for a coach/umpire meeting.

- 1. The midpoint of the foul line (coach's side).
- 2. The edge of the dirt circle, without entering.
- Used when coaches want to discuss plays on the field and rule interpretations, and to present lineup changes.
- Both parties have a chance to cool down, collect their thoughts and have a professional conversation.
- The days of angry coaches running onto the field are over.
- If a coach comes on the field, calmly remind him of the proper position before addressing the issue.

DO NOT make the coach wait for you or make the coach yell across the diamond to speak with you when he has done his part in waiting for you at the proper position.

The CIAC adopted this policy in 2023. It is modeled after Covid precautions developed at other levels in 2021.

Rules Quiz (Answers below)

- 1. Offensive malicious contact is defined as being:
 - a. Obstruction
 - b. Interference

- 2. With runners on base, the pitcher drops the ball during delivery:
