The historic Chubb Chapel United Methodist Church is a unique rural Methodist church established by eight Chubb brothers and their sisters, who were free-born Blacks. The Chubb family settled in a rural, picturesque area, about 80 miles northwest of Atlanta and five miles southeast of Cave Spring, Ga. before the Civil War and created a farming community called Chubbtown. In 1870, after the Civil War, the Chubb Family and neighbors built the church. It is currently the only remaining building from the original Chubbtown that is not residential. The church is on the National Register of Historical Places.

Today, members of the Chubb family and others continue to worship God and witness to the incredible love God has for each of us. The Chubb Chapel Church family, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ, seeks to be a church that reflects Christ's light in our homes, our workplaces, and our community. We aspire to be known not just for our words, but for our love, our service, and our unwavering faith. We seek to stay rooted in prayer, steadfast in Scripture, and open to the leading of the Holy Spirit.
