

## Fruit of The Spirit – Worksheet #1



- 1) Do you ever find yourself wanting to do something that you know deep down you will regret?
- 2) What have you found to be helpful to work through those times of temptation?
- 3) According to Galatians 5:16-17, what is going on inside every Christian? What causes the Christian's inner moral conflict?
- 4) Explain Galatians 5:18
- 5) Would you say that you are led by the Spirit (Gal. 5:18)? Why or why not?
- 6) Do you follow your own course, or do you lean on God to guide you?
- 7) In Galatians 5:19-21 Paul mentions 17 "works of the Flesh", list them and make sure you know the definitions/meaning of all that he listed and be prepared to discuss
- 8) Which of the works of the flesh are most common and most acceptable in our culture?
- 9) What will happen to those who continue to give in to the "works of the flesh" (Gal 5:21)?
- 10) Why is it easy to see the sins of the flesh in others and not within ourselves?
- 11) What does it mean to "crucify the flesh" and how do you practically crucify the flesh? (Give an example of how you are trying to do that in your own life.)
- 12) Explain the difference between the active crucifying of your own flesh (Gal. 5:24) and your passive crucifixion with Christ (Gal. 2:20).
- 13) What is difference between the fruit of the spirit and the Beatitudes (Matthew 5)
- 14) What is the difference between the Fruit of Spirit and Spiritual Gifts
- 15) Is Fruit of the Spirit singular or plural
- 16) Read John 13:31-38 (Love and Discipleship)
- 17) What did Jesus know about his disciples while showing the Father's love to them in this passage? How did he deal with them? What does this teach us?
- 18) Notice Christ says this is a "New Commandment." How is it different than the commandment in Leviticus 19:18?

19) “By this everyone will know you are my disciples if you love one another.” What do you think it means to be Jesus’ disciple? (See also 1 John 2:9-10, 3:10, 16-20, 4:7-12, John 15:8)

20) How do we love with His love? (See John 15:7-12)

21) 1 Corinthians 13 Refers to Love as “Charity” Why do you think Paul didn’t just use the word “love”?

22) 1 Corinthians 13:4

*4 Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,*

In your own words, what does this verse mean (Explain each part).

23) 1 Corinthians 13:5

*Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil;*
