
Transition current PIE private bank account to MEF account Tax exempt & donation status through MEF 501(c)3 Use of online payment engine

Fundraiser Goal: **\$12,000** Raised: **\$29,000** Event Expenses (prizes, pizza, etc.): **\$5,000 Total Revenue: \$24,000**

HOW WE USED IT:

\$9,500 - - Field Work PK-8 (including Cal-Wood)

\$10,000 - Supplemental research texts (books)

\$2,000 - Student celebrations

\$2,000 - School Events (Multicultural, Fun Run)

2023-2024 - Fundraiser Goals

2023-2024 Goal: \$14,000

BREAKOUT: \$3,000 - Bloomz (family communication app)

\$9,000 - Field Work
