





Incoming leaders start year with proactive mindset April is here and spring has finally arrived. Be sure to review and implement the programs of the 2024-2025 Grand Lodge Program booklet so you can continue showing "Elkdom's Heart For America." Make sure that you have all your committees prepared and that committee members know their responsibilities. Communication is the key. Financially, it is the Trustees and Officers who need to submit a budget to the Lodge for adoption no later than Pre-registration for Convention opens in April GRAND SECRETARY Bryan R. Klatt Online pre-registration for the Grand Lodge Session in Kansas City opens April 1 and will be available at elks.org/ convention/prereg.cfm through June 25. Registration will be open on Friday, June 27, from noon until 4:00 p.m. in the Kansas City Convention Center. Be advised, Exhibitors and Vendors will not be open at this time. Normal registration and Vendor/Exhibitor hours will begin Saturday, June 28, at 8:00 am. The online pre-registration fee is \$50 for all Members. The on-site registration fee will be \$60. A current credit card for PayPal will be needed. There is no fee for a non-Elk spouse or guest. A registration badge will be required to enter the exhibit hall and all business sessions. Message from the Grand Exalted Ruler DOUGLAS A. SCHIEFER the last regular meeting in April or the following regular meeting. Your Lodge should be ready to present a sound budget to your Members. The annual report for the previous year is also due May 1 so make sure that your FRS financial reporting system is up to date. On a housekeeping note, you should review any by-laws or house rules and regulations that need to be updated. It's for the good of the Lodge to make everything orderly and that you always prioritize the integrity and safety of the Lodge. On a festive note, it's time to make a calendar of social events for your Lodge. Create reasonable, achievable monthly events that will excite and attract your membership. Outside of your Lodge you are encouraged to establish a community project that emphasizes charitable work. Your Lodge life should always have a balance of what you do inside your Lodge and outside in the community you serve. Don't forget to set aside May 1-7 as Elks National Youth Week. All Lodges are urged to sponsor programs dedicated to the youth of our country. Julia and I wish you a blessed Easter season. It is a celebratory time for our family. Well, by now all of your officers should have been nominated and elected. I want to wish you all good luck and to having a very successful lodge year. Exalted Rulers - for some of you this is the last month as leader of your lodge. I hope you all had an interesting and enjoyable time in the big chair. New Exalted Rulers - by now you should have appointed all of your committee chairpersons. It is not only important to have a chairperson in position for your lodge committees, it is very important to have someone that will take that position seriously. The first step is to notify the Elk you have chosen that they are the chairperson. Each committee should have a manual describing their responsibilities. The chairperson needs to be aware of and willing to fulfill them. Your lodge budgets should be complete or close to it. A budget is

mainly an educated guess on how your lodge will do in the coming year, so please try to have a realistic budget for your members to vote on. That means don't inflate your income numbers or come in way too low on your expenses. If you are way off on your numbers, you are only doing your lodge and your members a disservice. At the end of February we had 406 candidates awaiting initiation. If we can initiate all of these candidates we will finish the year with another gain in membership. We have this month to make our association grow. So, let's get these candidates processed and make them a part of the greatest organization in America


