Here's what's happening at Vientos Bajos now:

1) Activities.

a

- a. **Pickleball:** We continue to offer space for two pickleball groups—one a more competitive group, the second a leisure group. Days and times vary, so if you're interested, please contact us to get on the WhatsApp list. Both groups continue to protect their bubble, playing with people with whom they've been playing for months, if not years.
- **b. Golf Simulator:** The golf simulator continues to improve. We've added a 36" monitor in addition to the 12' x 16' screen. Rick Reimer, our resident golf pro, has played all fifteen courses and is more than willing to walk you through the use of the simulator. Play requires knowledge of the system, and Rick will be happy to set you up and accompany your initial play. Please contact us to schedule a time if you want to try it out or join the league, now forming. Regular use is for golf club members only.



- **c. Poker:** Penny-ante Poker continues on Fridays. If you want to get in on a big game, this isn't the place. The bets are small, but the fun is big. Play begins at 12:30 PM and goes to 3:30 PM, but feel free to come late or leave early. Please get on our SignUp Genius app to ensure you're included for the Friday game.
- d. Contract Bridge: Tuesdays, 1:30 PM. Also known as Party Bridge, this is for those who want to spend a couple of hours together playing a little less competitive form of bridge than duplicate bridge. Most of us are pretty rusty on our skills. Please contact us beforehand if you want to play. We'd like to form groups in tables of four and would hate to have you come without having enough to complete a table.
- **e. Music groups.** All practice groups are now in session. Since we're now in practice for a MAY show, we're not open to new players unless you know your way around your instrument. We provide sheet music for all groups.
 - i. Ukulele Band, 10:30 AM, WED. We're now well on our way to perfecting our program for the May 16 presentation. This is a fun beginning music group, and although we're now closed to enrolment until after the May performance, please check in with us if you're interested in learning to play the ukulele and enjoy singalong with the rest of us Brementown musicians.
 - **ii.** Recorder Ensemble, 1 PM, WED. This group is for those who read music and have been exposed to the recorder. We currently have openings for all four parts—soprano, alto, tenor, and bass. We can provide a soprano recorder, but if you want to play an alto, tenor, or bass, you'll need to provide your own instrument.
 - iii. Blue Grass, 2 PM, WED. Right now this is considered a Blue Grass jam. We're currently i blessed to have Terry Handler for a cello fiddle lead, along with a mandolin, guitar, and bass. Although we're focusing on the May program, if you play, you're welcome to join us. Advance notice is appreciated since we're playing from sheet music and we'll need to make copies for you.
 - iv. Low Brass, 3 PM, WED. Trombones, baritones/euphoniums, and tubas. All musicians in the group can read music, but none is ready to play in the Boston Pops Orchestra. Our sheet music is generally level 1.5 to 2.5. As with all the other groups, we're currently closed to new players unless you've played with us before or can sight read easily. If you fit that category, you're more than welcome—but please let us know ahead of time so we can copy music for you.

- f. Other: The gym and library remain available for members. FYI: Recently, we added an inversion table/board to our gym equipment. The court is available for basketball when pickleball is not in play. We also have a professional ping pong table, which we will be setting up in the new recreation room.
- 2) Upcoming Events: Veterans of Service Organizations Day, SUN, MAY 16. Saturday, May 15, is US Armed Forces Day. We plan to celebrate it on SUNDAY by hosting a recognition day for anyone and everyone who has served in uniform. This includes first responders, such as police, medical, or firefighters, and also uniformed government veterans such as postal workers and state and national park employees. The celebration will consist of a noon potluck and be accompanied by entertainment provided by our various musical groups. There will be a small fee to cover set-up, service, and clean-up, and it will be BYOB. The event will be open to both veterans and those who want to celebrate the contributions of veterans. - 3) VB Construction/Changes: Conversion of upper pickleball court to Activities Room. Vientos Bajos began the year with new construction—beginning the long-planned third floor activities room. This 36' x 40' room will hold concerts, community theater, music rehearsals, pingpong matches, card and other table games, potlucks, big-screen cinema, and any other recreational and social activities that fit comfortably into this large space. We are also installing a small kitchenette, which will be available for the various activities. Design also includes an additional area for storage, the library, and a music practice room. Completion is expected by the end of March, although the room currently is in use.

In March and April, we will continue with anti-erosion work.
