Forever destined to NOT take up one of 12 stones from the Jordan River toward building a memorial to God's miracles. Yet, always driven to somehow acknowledge God's miracles...

An old man spotted a young family having Saturday breakfast at a diner: The Mom was very pregnant; the Dad wore a T-shirt, backwards baseball cap, and a harried grimace as their demanding toddler squirmed in a booster chair.

(The *Dobb*'s Decision rumors of overturning *Roe v. Wade* were rampant in the news. Pro-abortion, anti-SCOTUS rants filled both social media and the airways.)

Far from wealthy, the old man nonetheless paused at the young family's table on his way out of the diner with a folded \$20 bill in his hand. Looking directly at Dad, with a glance at Mom, the man outstretched his hand with the proffered money enclosed: "Sir, I congratulate you and your wife for loving life and not giving in to the abortionists. I would like the honor of contributing to this meal. Do have a wonderful day with God's life and with living."

Today, how can I—how will I—proffer a monument, or at least an acknowledgement, of God's basic miracle to me (to us): His miracle of living?



When we abide with Christ, he gives us freedom from man's rules, freedom to serve one another in love, and not be tied to the law. The law tries to protect people, but one cannot force a person to obey. Only God can free the heart to love with wild abandon.

Christ has freed us to be right with God, simply by faith. Once we were born again, Yahweh gave the special gift of the Holy Spirit to be with us daily! According to Paul, the Holy Spirit helps us to produce good fruit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

The world does not live like this. The world has a sinful nature which loves to do evil. These two opposing forces, the old sinful nature and the Holy Spirit, are always fighting one another. Our choices are never free from this conflict. Yet choosing the sinful nature leads to sexual immorality, impure thoughts, lustful pleasure, adultery, idolatry, participation in demonic activities, jealousy, hostility, arguing, divisions, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other kinds of sin.

Proverbs 6 describes 'worthless and wicked people' as constant liars with perverted hearts who plot evil. Solomon references the things God hates.

God is a Covenant-making God and He will honor our faithfulness and obedience to Him with protection, overturning our opposition, and fighting and winning our battles. He will help lead us to produce the fruits of the Holy Spirit instead of the fruits of the world.

PRAYER: Lord, help us to follow You always and live obedient to Your ways. Let us turn away from the world and instead, follow You and the Holy Spirit every day. In Jesus Name I pray, Amen.



Galatians 6

What do these Scriptures say about battles and victories?

God's plan is for us to live a victorious life, yet we find ourselves plagued with adversities streaming all around us: work, social media, TV, friends & family (not to mention our own temptations . . .) However, nothing catches God by surprise. God told Joshua to march his army around the walls of Jericho for 6 days, and on the 7th day, to blow the trumpet. 

<u>Joshua 22</u> The Rush to Judgement ~or~ "People like me drive a BMW; you drive a Ford Focus..."

Three tribes, Reuben, Gad and the half tribe of Manasseh, are told to return to their homes in Gilead, on the other side of the Jordan. There, they built an altar which the other tribes found offensive. The Israelites gathered to make war against the three tribes. They assumed the three tribes had built an altar to a foreign god. They were wrong.

Reuben, Gad and Manasseh built the altar as a witness. In the future the other tribes might assume that the Jordan River was to be used as a barrier to separate them from the other tribes resulting in separation from Israel. When the priests heard the real reason for the altar, they realized they had rushed to judgement.

Why do people rush to judgement? There are many reasons. Perhaps the main reason is a desire to be morally superior or to assume the worst in people. It's a sinful desire to say, "I'm holier than thou."

The rush to judgement has a familiar voice:

"People like me drive a BMW. People like you drive a Ford Focus."

- "People like *me* deserve to sit in the front row of the synagogue. People like *you* don't deserve to."
- "People like *me* know the rabbi on a first name basis. The rabbi isn't all that interested in people like *you*."
- And onwards

The Bible doesn't approve of this lack of humility. "*God is opposed to the proud but gives grace to the humble.*" James 4:6. It was wrong for the tribes of Israel to assume the tribes were rebelling. Joshua 22 doesn't mention it, but they probably felt like fools by rushing to judgement.

Pride goeth before a fall. No one is better than anyone else. (However, I will admit that I wouldn't be caught dead driving a Ford Focus! (b))

June 22 Continued . . .

Proverbs 23 Brooks Brother's vs. K-Mart ~or~ The Difference Between The Valuable and The Cheap

The first few verses deal with riches. In verses 1-8 the comparisons are in value: "The food of the rich is deceptive: 'He says eat and drink but he doesn't mean it.' Cast but a glance at riches and they are gone."

Basically, Solomon warns about desiring wealth. The fool is the one who can't tell the true value of anything. "*He will scorn the wisdom of your words.*"

Verses 10-11 warn against not knowing the value of a boundary: Don't move it! "*Their defender is strong and he will take up their case against you*."

The remainder of the chapter offers warnings against ignoring wisdom and instruction: "Apply your heart to wisdom. Don't envy sinners. Their investments are worthless. Buy truth and don't sell it. The father of the righteous has joy."

Moral of the story: Go for *value*, not savings. Savings is deceptive if your investment isn't worth much. Investing in sin, folly, and drunkenness has no value; it will ruin your formal attire when you get beat up in your dress up!

(Also: Brooks Brothers has a no refund on damaged items...)

James 2

"Uh. You know the inappropriately dressed homeless guy you just threw out of the Sunday service? That was Jesus."

James chapter 2 is an obvious, but (too) often overlooked problem: special treatment for the VIPs and not so much for the kitchen staff!

I was in a fellowship where this was ignored 100% of the time. The hotsy totsy types were always showcased. Doctors and attorneys were made members immediately. The under than \$20,000 a year were often not allowed formal membership.

--Not sure if Jesus could have made the cut --Probably not.

Therefore, confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. James 5:16 (NIV)

Habakkuk 2:2-3 AMP

2 And the Lord answered me and said, Write the vision and engrave it so plainly upon tablets that everyone who passes may [be able to] read [it easily and quickly] as he hastens by. 3 For the vision is yet for an appointed time and it hastens to the end [fulfillment]; it will not deceive or disappoint. Though it tarry, wait earnestly for it because it will surely come; it will not be behind hand on its appointed day.

What has God downloaded in your Spirit? Has He given you a vision? Then what are YOU waiting for? Write it down, Write the vision!

Habakkuk 2

Meanwhile, what has he already given you, write that vision down. His promises have assured you that it will not tarry. To tarry means to wait, to abide, or stay in. It shall come to pass.

Habakkuk's transparent interchange with God models for us a *real* relationship with the Lord rather than a religious one. This biblical passage says to wait earnestly, and it shall come to pass. How exciting to wait in expectation—seriously and zealous in intention, purpose, or effort! As you wait for it, take a step of faith today. Ask God in prayer, and through fasting, find more directives about the vision he has given you.

God has called you to be a visionary! Through these visions and dreams, receive and continue to believe that these are God-given and are great possibilities of hope when articulated with enthusiasm! Stay encouraged and ask what God would like you to do and keep a journal. Yes, write it down, make it clear, and be inspiring to those who read it. Hearing the voice of God is the birthright of the born again. Habakkuk gives a great example of the posture that he took before God, enabling him to hear his voice.

How is your posture today? Be honest. Where would God like you to start? Need some encouragement? Counsel, from even a friend, can encourage you along the way!

Proverbs 27:9 NLT

The heartfelt counsel of a friend is as sweet as perfume and incense. Wow, I can't even imagine where I would be today without a support team of good friends. Friends that have loved on me and given me some heartfelt counsel.

This journey in life has had some seasons of great friends who have encouraged, empowered, and edified me along the way. Be encouraged to surround yourself with friends who understand the vision God has birthed within you!

Habakkuk 3 Proverbs 28 1 Peter 2

~~The LORD is your strength be bold as a Lion~~

Habakkuk 3: 17-19

17 Though the fig tree may not blossom, Nor fruit be on the vines; Though the labor of the olive may fail, And the fields yield no food; Though the flock may be cut off from the fold, And there be no herd in the stalls- 18 Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation. 19 The LORD God is my strength; He will make my feet like deer's feet, And He will make me walk on my high heels.

Through life's ups and downs, our faith can be shaken a bit . . . or a "lot-a-bit." Life can either make us or break us in our faith. In this passage, we see that Habakkuk focused his attention on God rather than on the circumstances. This is not always easy, especially when we acknowledge the difficulties in our situations. He asked genuine questions, waited for God's answers, and accepted them. He put his hope in God and experienced his presence. In faith, we must look beyond our present circumstances. Like Habakkuk did, we must place every bit of hope that we have left on God and rely on God's promises. Ultimately, we must set our hearts and eyes on God. Habakkuk focused and was strong in the LORD.

To be focused means to make concentrated, dedicated efforts toward the accomplishment of a task. In this case, Habakkuk focused on God and His promises through his faith.

Are you distracted, alone, or feeling afraid in your current circumstances? Be encouraged to focus on Jesus and trust Him to get you through any storm just like Habakkuk did! Refuse to be afraid, remain focused on Jesus, and you will be able to walk in faith and victory no matter the circumstance. As you focus on God, peace and joy will be your portion!
