## ADVENTURES OF THE POTOMAC DOGWOODS 1975-1992

How many of us remember where we were and what we were doing on August 3, 1975? To quote from a camping journal "about 20 people gathered at Algonquin Park, near Sterling Park. There was born the Potomac Dogwoods camping group."

Dick Rummel was mostly responsible for getting the group together. He and his family had just finished a tour of duty in Alaska and headed for the lower 48 states driving a 30' motorhome, towing a car and behind that a boat. The motorhome was named Blue Whale.

Representing Good Sam was Jay Woods, State Director, and Jim Langston, State Legislator. Quite a meeting was held. Everyone identified themselves and their family, a sketchy camping schedule was laid out and future meetings were planned.

The first get-together was in Williamsburg for a Samboree at Green Tree Campground, then affiliated with Howard Johnson. Six members of the newly formed Potomac Dogwoods were present.

A list of campgrounds has been included, naming each of them as we visited them for the first time (see attached). As time progressed new members joined, new ideas, new campgrounds. Don't accept this list as the only ones that were visited, time and work schedules took the group to everything near and far. By the time the '90's had arrived, most every campground within 150 miles of Northern Virginia had been visited, and with new ones opening, names changing and new owners with different ideas, it was worth revisiting the old ones.

The fee for camping has certainly kept up with the ever changing economy, along with the cost of vehicles and equipment to relax and enjoy an exclusive hobby, a pastime enjoyed by millions all over the world.

The Good Sam Samborees and other special camping events are in a class of their own. Everyone made their own decisions, which ones to attend, etc., but there were other places to meet and continue the terrific friendship, especially in the chilly and freezing weather. Most campgrounds are closed for the winter but think of the warmth and comfort of so many of the members' homes. This opens up a whole new horizon ... no hook-ups, no long walks to the chow-line and then wait your turn in line to be served; food is always just an arm's length away.

The meetings are always pretty much the same, with all phases being worked out, pro and con, new ideas, new members. The first home we met at was the Johansens in Vienna VA (December 1975). The next meeting was held at the Price's home in Alexandria, VA (January 1976) followed by a February meeting at the Ervings, and even a summer meeting at the Rummel's home in Sterling Park (July 1976) and the almost annual visit to the Hoffman's for the first Christmas get-together. Other homes we visited over the years were the Oikkoner's, Connie Conrad's (again Sterling Park) and even back in those days, the Timmins. In the 1980's we had the pleasure of enjoying the homes of the Robyaks, Goellers, Chisms, Donnellys, Lindquists, Gonzales, Marvins, Earls and Kenyons.

We can't forget all the restaurants where we dined, held our meetings, elected new officers and even celebrated Christmas. The first Dinner Theater outing was at the Holiday Inn at Dulles Airport, next the Hayloft in Manassas, followed by the gang meeting at Shakey's Pizza in Hybla Valley, Farrells at Tysons Corner, Fretzbes at Fairfax Circle, Hot Shoppe in Fredericksburg, Dennys in Fairfax, Pan Am Restaurant in Vienna, S&W Cafeteria in Falls Church. We enjoyed the West End Dinner Theatre in Alexandria a couple of times and even had a meeting at the Wakefield Park Recreation Center in Kings Park and a meeting and pot luck at the Nottaway Field House in Vienna.

Some of the family pets that joined us on our camping adventures were: the Rummel's dog RAGS, Janet Rasmussen's two great dogs, MISTY and then JINX, Erving's cat BUTTONS, the Goellers had an old timer called SNICKELFRITZ, Janice Hudson had her companion SMOKEY, and the Donnellys had their JODY and now PEPE. The Earls, Gonzales and Knowltons had pets but their names escape us at this time. However, it is the Kenyons who have the most unusual pet, a 'pet' known world-over, DONALD DUCK!

Can anyone complain about the potluck meals that were shared? Think of how those cook books must be expanding after all the recipes that were exchanged!

There were several novel or different things that started, or happened, amongst the Potomac Dogwoods. In March of 1982 Carlton Earl and Ed Timmins designed and built an outstanding sign that announced the Potomac Dogwoods by carrying the family name of each family in attendance at the outing. An extra non-scheduled meeting was held at the Robyak's house to stuff goody bags for the annual Samboree in May of 1984. Jean Erving was called upon in 1984 to travel and drive a vehicle when the Olympic Torch went across the country. In May 1979 we were host to a group of Caravaners (campers) from England. They flew to Montreal Canada, picked up motorhomes and toured most of the East coast. On their return trip we met them at Prince William Park in Dumfries and put on a potluck supper. Friendship, conversation, traveling tales, and even some gifts, were exchanged long into the night.

The now popular parade at the Samborees in our area was originated at the Samboree at Glen Maury Park in September 1983. Jean Erving (Krisko the Clown) was entertaining the children, and walking back to the motorhome, a few Potomac Dogwoods fell in behind

her gathering noisemakers, bells, a train whistle and anything else they could think of to liven up the occasion. The parade continued around the campground visiting a few campers in wheel chairs and others not participating in the activities. Prizes are now awarded for the best entry and the Potomac Dogwoods have won their share.

In October of 1990 we were somewhat surprised to add a new word to our vocabulary - SAURUS. Never knew one word could take on so many ways to enhance the word, camping and just about everything affiliated. Thanks, Jan. And from the same household, Dave has earned a Masters in Coffee Making (the coffee shootout and crew chief in Tampa, 1991).

To continue our uniqueness, how about the way we distribute Christmas gifts? Not the hum-drum exchanging or calling a name. Everyone is equal in a fun loving game of holding the right playing card and picking an unopened gift from the men's or ladies' pile of gifts (or maybe stealing somebody else's prize).


