It is a depletion problem. Staff absorb the trauma of the families they serve, then are handed a self-care flyer and told to hydrate. Wellness initiatives fail because they treat exhaustion as an individual failing rather than an organizational condition. This session names what is actually happening: secondary trauma, compassion fatigue, and the emotional labor of the classroom carried with nowhere to put it. Participants work through five steps - Recognize, Release, Reset, Reinforce, and Renew - that give both frontline staff and supervisors concrete language for the conversations wellness programs usually avoid. The tone is direct and conversational rather than clinical. Participants leave with a personal reset plan and practices a supervisor can implement Monday morning without a budget line. Learning objectives: 1. Distinguish burnout, compassion fatigue, and secondary traumatic stress, and recognize early indicators in themselves and their colleagues. 2. Apply the five-step wellness framework to build a personal reset plan with specific, measurable practices. 3. Identify at least three no-cost organizational changes a supervisor can implement to reduce staff depletion and improve retention.
