#### SCENA 4 NELLA CASA DELLA **FATA**

# ARIA: LULLABY OF THE FAIRY

An aria is a special song that expresses a profound feeling, often an emotion that indicates how the story of the opera may be moving in a new direction. In an aria, the words and the music together form a melody that is pleasant to the ears, and which generally does not have any repeats, or only very few. The Fairy's lullaby is meant to calm and reassure the poor puppet, after all the dreadful things that happened to him.

If you were going to write a song to sing a child to sleep, which words would you use? Which colors come to mind when you think about a lullaby?




### IN PINOCCHIO PARK...


Leitmotif is a theme or musical phrase that repeats.



# LEITMOTIF OF THE THREE CROW DOCTORS


The Three Crow-Doctors repeat that *they are important*, that they *have cured many sick people*, that *all of these have gotten better*, etc. The say many funny things in their Trio, and as you can see, **Pinocchio** is neither dead nor asleep! When **Pinocchio** hears that they want to give him an injection, he awakens immediately from fear!





The Fairy then turns to Pinocchio and asks him to tell her the story of everything that happened to him and why he was tied to the oak tree in the dark wood.







In this scene, **Pinocchio** and the **Fairy** sing, always with music, but in a more spoken way, that is, in **Recitative**. **Pinocchio** explains what happened, but he tells a bunch of lies to the **Fairy**, who remains unconvinced. **Pinocchio's** nose, which grows longer with every lie, reveals the fibs that he is saying.

...and the Fairy pronounces the famous words from Collodi's book:

Fairy: Lies, my child, are quickly recognized because they come in two kinds:

There are lies that have short legs...

Pinocchio: (spoken) Really?

Fairy: ...And there are lies that have long noses --And yours is one of those that has a long nose! Do you agree with the saying of the Fairy? \_\_\_\_\_

Why? or why not?

Pinocchio promises the Fata that he will tell no more lies and that he will be an honest person. She encourages him to keep his promise. We will see in the next scene what is going to happen.
