The scene begins with an aria of remorse, sung by Pinocchio, "*Fearful is the Sea*"

Pinocchio, now a mule, is at the shore of the sea, and looks towards the waves, hoping for his father. He expresses his remorse for not haveing appreciated the love of his father and he remembers all the sacrifices that Geppetto made for him. He swears to give up his own life for the salvation of Geppetto. The Fairy enters, and praises Pinocchio for "the generosity of his heart" and she transforms him back into a puppet.

At this point, Pinocchio throws himself into the sea and is swallowed by the Whale.




ARIA

Meanwhile, Geppetto, seated in the belly of the whale sings his aria of woe, which expresses his sorrow and grief. He believes that he will never see his little son again, and cannot raise him to be happy and to enjoy life together with him, a life that promised so many wonders. Geppetto finishes this aria with a desperate prayer to God, to protect the child that he believes is so far away from him.



Inside the belly of the gigantic Whale, father and son find each other and their joy is immense. Suddenly, Pinocchio exclaims, "Let's get out of *here*!" Geppetto doubts they can make it to shore, but Pinocchio insists. Geppetto leans on Pinocchio, who, made of wood, floats and cannot sink. Dragging his father, Pinocchio swims towards the shore. Geppetto is saved, but, from the exhaustion of the swim, Pinocchio arrives on the beach half-dead.
