



## Peace Programme

Karamoja has been a place of violent tribal warfare for decades. Peace initiatives mediated by CLIDE Consultancy in partnership with Church of Uganda: Karamoja, have brought glimmers of hope to the Bokora and Pian sub-tribes of the Karamojong.

In 2007, with the help of elders from churches in the US, we began to draw warring Karamojong leaders towards reconciliation and forgiveness. Out of that intervention, communities decided to restore their relationships and come together in peace villages, forgiving one another and joining hands in various development projects. After our Peace Prayer summit in Nabwal, joint settlements were established in the former war zone. The former warring communities responded very positively, sending thousands of new resettlers to the new peace communities.

Now, 10 years later, we have over 23,000 people resettled in these villages, living, working and intermarrying in peace.

We empower traditional healers to develop their best herbal medicines, including those that Improve milk production and those that fight diseases and parasites. They can then develop these into commercial products. We also work with community groups to develop quality, indigenous-based milk and meat products for home and commercial use.

## What Does CLIDE Do?

Community Livestock Integrated Development Consultancy (CLIDE Consultancy) began in 2007 with a vision of community empowerment and wholistic health and development.

CLIDE's main focus is with the Karamojong people in Uganda. We partner with churches and development partners to provide skills-based trainings to families to elevate them into more sustainable livelihoods. Our programmes are multi-faceted, aimed to improve the livelihood skills of the local communities through:

- ⇒ Livestock-based training and Development
- ⇒ Agricultural Group Farming
- ⇒ Micro-Enterprise Development through Value-Addition
- ⇒ Development of Ethno-Veterinary Medicines and Indigenous Knowledge
- ⇒ Natural resource Management
- ⇒ Capacity Building through Educational Scholarships
- ⇒ Peace Building with warring tribes.



## Livestock Programmes

The communities that we work with in Eastern Uganda are heavily dependent on livestock. Loss of animals through diseases, raiding or poor husbandry can be devastating for families. To face these challenges, CLIDE implements three main livestock-based interventions:



1. Livestock Revolving Loans for orphans and widows. (Goats, Camels & Turkeys).
2. Training in Livestock Health and Husbandry: including Community Animal Health Workers, Value Adding on Livestock Products and Training of Trainers.
3. Research & Development of Indigenous Herbal Veterinary Medicines (Ethno-Vet).
