GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

* **All Exhibitors - Please read these rules and specific rules in Categories you are entering.**

1. All classes open to Exhibitors in the province of Saskatchewan, except where stated.
2. Interpretation of all rules to be decided by the Directors of the Society.
3. **ENTRIES AND FEES** should be in the Agricultural Office **by 5:00 P.M. on Friday, July 12, 2019.** * Entries will **not** be accepted by telephone. Entries made after the deadline may be subject to a late fee. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER MONDAY JULY 15/19.**
4. **Entry fees are 10% of First Prize.**
5. **All entries** should be listed on the entry form in the order that they are numbered in the prize list. **PLEASE make a duplicate list** on plain paper, to hand in with the articles to be exhibited.
6. In **Group Classes**, each **exhibitor** may enter up to a maximum of **5** entries in each group, (unless otherwise stated); and up to a maximum of **3** entries in **Senior Group Classes**.

7. **Entry tags** may be picked up in the Office. All exhibits must have entry tags **securely and conspicuously** attached and **properly classified** before being placed in the Exhibit Hall. It is the **Responsibility of the Exhibitor** to completely fill in the entry tag before placing on exhibit. Please print on tags.

8. **Mailed parcels** must be sent to the Melfort Agricultural Society and **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ITEMIZED LIST OF CONTENTS.** Mailed parcels must be in the Melfort Agricultural Society Office by Monday July 15, 2019.
9. Parcels received by mail will be **returned COLLECT** by the Society.
10. **EXHIBITS may be brought to the Hall on WEDNESDAY, JULY 17, 2019 from 7:30 to 8:30 P.M. and on THURSDAY, JULY 18, 2019 from 8:30 to 9:30 A.M.**

11. **Exhibitors may** be required to make a **statutory declaration** that the work they exhibit is their own and has **not** been **previously entered** at the Melfort Exhibition. The Directors reserve the right to disqualify any suspect article, if the Exhibitor is not present to make a declaration.

12. The **Judge** will **not** award a first, or any prize, if the exhibit is considered unworthy.

13. Neither the Agricultural Society nor any of its officials shall be responsible for the loss or injury from what so ever cause, to exhibits, persons or property; neither for typographical errors that appear in the prize list.

14. **The Exhibit Hall** will be **closed** from 6:00 to 7:00 P.M. on the last evening of the Exhibition.

15. * **Exhibits must be picked up** between **the hours of 7:00 and 8:00 P.M.** on the last evening of the Exhibition at the **West door**. Directors will **not** be responsible for exhibits after that time. **Prizes may be picked up at this time.**

HORTICULTURE

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. All exhibits of grains, cut flowers, and vegetables shall be composed of the exact number of properly named specimens of the size and quantity indicated; otherwise they will be disqualified. (Names of varieties to be on the exhibit tag.)
2. **The Exhibits** may be **brought in Thursday evening (July 18) from 7:30 to 8:30 P.M.**
*** ONLY Horticulture Exhibits may be brought in Friday morning, (July 19), until 10 A.M.**
3. **The Exhibit Hall** will be **closed** from 6:00 to 7:00 P.M. on the last evening of the Exhibition.
4. * **Exhibits must be picked up** between **the hours of 7:00 and 8:00 P.M.** on the last evening of the Exhibition at the **West door**. Directors will **not** be responsible for exhibits after that time.
5. **Entry Fee** will be 10% of first prize.
6. More than 1 entry per class is allowed, if each entry is a **different** variety. **Variety** shall be plants within the kind that differ from one another in one or more special characteristics.
(i.e., - Homesteader and Green Arrow are varieties of peas.)
7. **Seed Exhibits** must be cleaned of wood seeds and foreign material; and be displayed in a quart sealer.
8. **Variety must be named.** It is the **Responsibility of the Exhibitor to fill in the entry tag completely, including variety name.**
9. **The judge** will not award a first or any prize if it is considered that the exhibit is of inferior quality.

*** NOTE :** To be eligible for the Special Prize in Classes J610 to J613, boys or girls entering must state their age on the entry form.

NORTHEAST REGIONAL OPEN GRAINS & GRASSES SHOW

All sheaves of grains and grasses must be triple banded and approximately **4 inches in diameter** at the middle band. Cereal grains must be stripped of leaves and roots, and free of excess moisture to prevent mold. Length of the sheaves for classes 500 to 514 must **be between 18" to 24" of straw**. Grasses and legumes must be well cured as for hay in storing conditions. * Only sheaves of recommended Varieties and Size are eligible to show.

TERMINOLOGY:

1. Bloom - Any bud showing colour will be considered a bloom. Therefore, where a specific number of blooms is called for in the prize list, **additional buds showing colour** at the time of judging **will disqualify the entry**.

2. Stem - Commonly used to describe a portion of a plant with side shoots or side branches - i.e., Clarkia, Phlox, Salpiglossis.

- **Flower stems** should be straight and firm, of good length and well furnished with foliage.

* RULES AND REGULATIONS *

1. **All articles in these classes must be made by the Exhibitor. No awards** will be given for articles which **have won prizes** at the Melfort Exhibition **prior to 2019.**
2. The **Judge** will **not** award a first, or any prize, if the exhibit is considered unworthy.
3. No **exhibit soiled** from improper laundering, use or care, will be awarded a prize. Articles must **not** be exhibited on any, but colourfast material. Any articles requiring starching should be **lightly starched.**
4. Exhibits classed as a **COLLECTION**, are judged only as a collection, and **must** have an entry tag on ONE article and the class number on EACH article in the collection.
5. Do NOT use coloured tissue or crepe paper for displaying articles. Use cardboard, coloured or white is preferred.
