- **Veil-Walking Rites:** Burned or carried to open the senses before trance, scrying, or spirit-work.
- **Banishing Spells:** Added to blends that drive out unwanted presences or stagnant energies.
- **Necromantic Work:** Used to steady the spirit and clarify communication with the dead or ancestral guides.
- **Cord-Cutting:** Incorporated into severance rituals for clean, decisive release.
- **Protective Wards:** Placed at thresholds to deter wandering spirits or subtle intrusion.

Wormwood is a herb of cold illumination. It does not comfort; it reveals. It does not soothe; it severs. Call upon it when the veil must thin, when clarity must be carved from shadow, or when your space requires a bitter, decisive cleansing. Treat it as a companion of silver fire — stark, spectral, and unwavering in its purpose.
