MONTESANO (Special) — Arrangements to provide Eastern Grays Harbor County families with surplus food assistance will be discussed by R. E. (Jack) Willis, East County Red Cross chapter chairman, with Grays Harbor County commissioners Monday, April 3.

Willis said many upcounty people have scant resources with which to get them to the distribution center in Aberdeen to obtain food.

Meanwhile, volunteers from the chapter are seeking to wind up a drive for finances. Robert Seisher and Earl Boling collected nearly \$300 in the Elma business district, according to Elma Chairman, Mrs. William Moore. House-to-house "mop-up" collections are being made in Elma also.
