California Advanced Services Fund (CASF) Phase IV Grant Awarded to CCBC

Submission Date: July 2022 Award Date: January 2023

CASF Project Proposal

developing and supporting broadband projects funded by the CASF Infrastructure grant program, including deployment of open access middle mile facilities (when deemed indispensable), construction of new and upgraded last mile infrastructure, and making access to those projects affordable via alternative funding vehicles. CCBC will also seek to leverage money available from other public and private sources to supplement and conserve CASF infrastructure funds and to pursue expanded adoption, access and deployment goals.

Resolution

It is ordered that the Commission shall award \$1,000,000 to the Central Coast Broadband Consortium (CCBC). The commencement of the grant will be February 1st, 2023: \$200k per year for the duration of 5 years.

Budget Proposal

CCBC requests \$1,000,000 for a five-year grant.8 The requested grant amount will allocate approximately 48% to market analysis and outreach to identify potential infrastructure projects and encourage deployment (Objectives 1 and 2), 17% will be for direct assistance to ISPs and local agencies during the grant application process (Objective 3), 14% will be used for sourcing other funding opportunities and publicizing their availability (Objective 4), and the remaining 21% will be split between publicizing requests for wireline testing volunteers, GIS support and fiscal/management oversight (Objective 5). CCBC's budget is consistent with the budgetary requirements stated in D.22-05-029.

- Providing assistance to providers submitting CASF infrastructure applications through data mapping and technical support
- Identifying and removing specific barriers to broadband infrastructure deployment that affect projects developed and submitted for CASF infrastructure grants
- Assisting the Commission with wireline testing as needed
- Promoting broadband deployment throughout the Monterey Bay region of Santa Cruz, San Benito, and Monterey counties Finding additional grant funding through local, state and federal revenue streams and public-private partnerships that can provide any necessary matching funds and improve the long-term sustainability of projects developed and submitted for CASF infrastructure grants
- Delivering direct, project-specific mapping, data analysis and community support assistance to ISPs and local agencies as they develop and implement broadband infrastructure deployment projects
- Working with technical experts, public works officials and economic development professionals to create common specifications, policies and practices that encourage and facilitate broadband deployment

- Facilitating conversations between independent and incumbent ISPs, local and state policy makers and regional businesses and institutions
- Providing policy makers with tools, resources and a planning structure they can use to pursue local broadband projects and initiatives.
