CAMP TIMLO - Diamond Point, N.Y., December, 1966

informal report on november travels

It probably would be more accurate to include the last week in October for this informal, rambling report of our travels and visits. Originally, the plan was to drive west to Illinois and Wisconsin and then to proceed south through Indiana and Kentucky to Alabama. However, an airplane took the place of the car and it was leap-frog from Lake George to Chicago. While in downtown Chicago for two days attending a meeting, I had a chance to talk with somewhere we had appointments to interview counsellor of the parents of our Illinois delegation, the parents of RICK STEARNS, DANNY HALPERIN, KENNY GURRENTZ and DAVE STRANDBERG. Because we are returning to Illinois in January or February, we will delay any report of the activities of these campers until then.

Talked with LARRY KAPPAUF on the telephone. He is a few hundred miles north of Chicago, in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Had we driven to Chicago and taken our trip through Indiana and Kentucky, we would have stopped to see PHIL WOODLIEF at his new home in Louisville, Kentucky, and DAN KOENIG and JIM SAUERLAND in Indiana.

After returning to Lake George by plane, Margie, Stacey, Dutchess, and I began our southerly trip together, at least as far as Syracuse, N.Y., where we parted. They went on to Warren, Pa., and I proceeded South. Cornell University, where ALAN CODY and JERRY FISHER are attending school, was some thirty miles west of my route and it was during the day so a telephone call was not attempted. Likewise, traveling down the northern extension of the Pennsylvania Turnpike, it was during school hours when I passed near Forty-Fort and Kingston, where JIM and JED PEARSALL and RICK DAVIES live.

Passing Baltimore, where MIKE McCARTHY, JIM MURPHY and ALAN MOORE live, I traveled on to Washington, where STEVE, LEE, and JIM HESSBERG, DAVE WEAVER, JOEL and BRUCE RUSSO, and TEX

LADISH live, stopping late at night near Roanoke Rapids, North Carolina. It is our plan to speak with or visit the Baltimore and Washington area campers on our return north about December 3 or 4.

Traveling southwest from the North Carolina-Virginia border to Charlotte and Atlanta, our first major stop was at the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, where we had appointments to interview counsellor prospects. Walter Guyton, TIMLO counsellor from years ago, and RUTH and MIKE KINCAID, live in Tuscaloosa. JOAN PORTER, Pine Log Camp secretary, and a PINE LOG camper also live in Tuscaloosa.

From Alabama, the next stop was south of Jacksonville, Florida, to visit HARRY SOUTHWORTH and his family. Harry's father was a TIMLO counsellor in 1944. Being that close to Jacksonville, we had a good telephone visit with CLARK JOHNSTON. The next day in Indian River near Melbourne, the Space Center, I visited JOHN MAC NEILL and his family, and PETE BIXBY's family. John lives right on the banks of the Indian River. It was interesting to learn some of the background of that particular area of Florida. John and his father had just finished making a color TV set. They had some interesting color slides of TIMLO. PETE BIXBY is in school in Spain and won't return until June. Next I visited with JOE GUERRERO and his family in Belle Glade, Florida. This is one of the chief centers for sugar and a great percentage of all vegetables produced in the United States. Had a very pleasant lunch with the Guerreros, toured Dr. Guerrero's medical clinic, and then was taken on an automobile ride through the area seeing the sugar cane fields and the processing plants. It was very interesting. From Belle Glade, I traveled to the East Coast of Florida to Lauderdale-by-the Sea, north of Ft. Lauderdale. Talked with Mrs. Gomez, mother of Ed, who lives nearby, and also to one of the Pine Log counsellors. After Margie flew Down from Buffalo, N.Y. to join me for ten days, we called

ROMA and DEL JORDAN and got together with them for a very pleasant visit and a planning session for next summer. We also had a pleasant visit with BILL BREEDIN and his family in Miami. We are interviewing a few counsellor prospects in this state, too.

By the time we get back to Lake George in early December, we hope to hear from some of you not on the route of these early travels, so that we may pass on information about you to your friends. REMEMBER the reunion on Saturday, January 28, in New York City!
