

# TIMLOG

November, 1967

Events have moved rapidly since the last day of camp. After the close of the second successful Sailing Clinic, some of the staff, including ROMA and DEL JORDAN, ALAN CODY, DAVE WALKER, BRIAN FUSSELL, and BOB BREW, worked to finish closing camp and make repairs and prepare some of the camp for next June.

For a five-day period, including the Labor Day Weekend, Timlo entertained a football camp for thirty-five high school players from the Linghamton area. This was the first football camp since Coach Morris conducted his last one in the mid-'50s.

Our travels and some activities are a little behind schedule since Barr was on crutches for six weeks beginning September 2. This was the result of a high-powered tennis tournament. At long last the first trip started on November 3. This was also the day that ROMA and DEL JORDAN departed for Florida. This was the longest they had stayed up north. With Margie, Stacey, and Dorothy, (Dutchess stayed with the vet), we began our trip from Lake George, stopping the first afternoon and evening at the Marriott Motor Hotel in Saddle Brook, New Jersey, for a Camp Directors' Roundtable Meeting. The stay overnight and the meeting were pleasant and successful and the visit was marred only by Stacey getting on the automatic elevators by herself and getting off on the eleventh floor (our room was on the third floor). The next stop was Williamsport, Pa., which was to be our headquarters for four days. In nearby Lewisburg we visited THELMA and BOB LATOUR and their children CAROL and BOBBY. Thelma and Bob are Nurse and Head Counsellor respectively at Pine Log. We were there in time to witness Temple University defeat Bucknell in the last two minutes of play. On

Sunday we traveled thirty miles west to Lack Haven to visit BETTY and STAN DALEY and their daughter Susan. (Stan and his staff in athletics turned in one of the best jobs ever with the camp's sport program. We have already discussed with area camp directors plans for athletic competition for 1968. We shall return to at least our regular schedule of events with other camps prior to last year.) That evening we went with the Daleys to Harold Hacker's home for dinner. Mr. and Mrs. Hacker are on the staff at Pine Log Camp. We saw neither LARRY GLADHILL nor Lack Haven graduates ROBIN KLAR and PETE HOFFERT during our brief stay.

One other trip from our Williamsport base took us to Ithaca, N.Y., where we visited at Cornell University with ALAN CODY and RICK BUSH. We had a very pleasant visit at the ATO fraternity house and reminisced about the '67 season. Alan suggested two prospective staff members whom we interviewed. Rick is continuing his sailing with Penguins on Lake Cayuga. Alan is a Dorm Advisor. That same evening we saw BETSY and BOB NORTHROP. Bob was Waterfront Director at Timlo in the late '50s and more recently (1965) was Head Counsellor at Pine Log.

After returning to Lake George we went to see JOHN RHODES, one of the standouts on the Glens Falls High School football team, in his last game. Unfortunately, John had hurt his ankle the week before and didn't play. He plays both offense and defense and scored a number of touchdowns during the season. His team completed their season undefeated. JOHN LANCASTER, a Junior at the Albany Academy, had notable success as quarterback on the varsity this fall. His team, however, was not undefeated. John will be getting ready for swimming soon.

A few days ago we had a nice letter from BECKY and BILL GRAY from the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa. They related that MIKE KINCAID, a Senior Counsellor at Timlo four years ago, was recovering

We also received a letter from DAN KOENIG telling of his activities since camp and reporting that he is now practicing teaching in a school near Indianapolis, Indiana.
