

PROSPECT MOUNTAIN

How many of you have heard of the Prospect Mountain project which has been underway for almost two years? Interestingly enough, Prospect Nit. is the highest point just mid-way between Pine Log Camp and Camp Timlo. It is that mountain just west of Lake George Village, rising to an elevation of approximately 2,500 feet with a fire tower on top. The exciting news is that the project is ahead of schedule and is to be completed in the Spring of 1968. Wany of you traveling on the Northway between the two camps must have seen the sign which reads "Prospect Mountain State Parkway". The completion of this roadway from Lake George to the top of Prospect Nit. represents an idea which started at least some thirty years ago in the minds of a few far-sighted Lake George citizens. The Parkway winds and turns up the eastern slope of the mountain and finally, about five miles from the bottam, terminates at a parking area near the summit. The fire tower, as it is now, will no longer be there, and a large threestory building will be constructed for the benefit of the sightseers and tourists. The top of this building will be a large observation deck from which you will be able to see to the north end of Lake George and on a clear day the State Office Building in Albany.

I had the pleasure of a sneak-preview when the Chairman of the Authority invited me to accompany him to the summit for an inspection. The men were still paving the road and the foundation of the building was just getting underway. At the top there will be a massive stane wall around the area instead of a fence. If you have ever been up Not. Marcy or White Face, you can appreciate the beauty of the view and the feeling of being so far away from built-up areas. From the top it seems just as though you are in the midst of the forest preserve similar to the Not. Ivarcy area. It will be a great asset to this area to have such a facility available to the public. We shall certainly plan trips far the campers to the top of Prospect Mt. in '68. If possible, we shall try to get a few color slides of the project for the reunion.
