WINDUP OF 1968 SEASON AND BANQUET

Another summer of hard work, many achievements, and hours of fun at Camp Timlo ended with the presentation of awards at the season's closing banquet. After an excellent meal of roast beef with all the trimmings, the program began. Founder and Director, William Morris, started with a few introductory remarks. Awards and certificates were presented to campers; awards representing most of the major activities. Ston Daley gave the awards for athletics and the camp teams. The special archery awards were presented to Tommy Lapham, Jim Harney, and Doug Fogle for the three divisions. The award was a hunting razor arrow for the camper in each division who showed the most improvement during the season. In riflery the most improved marksman was Lobby Morehardt. Before the next presentations, the counsellors' singing group gave us a fine rendition of some of their popular songs. Next, Del Jordan made the sailing awards. Lorry Thal earned the Outstanding Skipper plaque and Jon Summers received the plaque for the most improved sailor. Rich Martin presented the Wampus award to Amos Hutchins as he was deemed the most active in the Wampus game. Rich went on to present the certificates to the newly elected Honor Braves. The 1968 Honor Braves were James Harney, Tex Lodish, Bab Lotour, Lorry Thal, Donald Boker, Kim Meuser, Craig Nitterhouse, Grant Swodos, John Humphrey, Richard Bierau, Doug Fogle, Amos Hutchins, James King, Bill Knox, Phillippe Soumerai, Bill Smith, and Joe Walton. Then followed more singing, after which Bruce Campbell awarded the Timlag Ts, one to each camper according to his scores on the achievement in the test. Steve Kodad then presented the tennis trophies. The first place Intermediate cup went to Mark Oppenheim and the second place trophy to Mike McCarthy. For the Seniors, Amos Hutchins received first place and Jim Hessberg the second place trophy.

As the evening was drawing to a close, Don Koenig and Borr awarded the Honor Awards and the Citizenship Awards. In the Junior Division, Dan presented first, second, and third place awards to George Stosior, Noah Kislevitz, and Steven Leicht. In fourth and fifth place were Matt Wolff and Dwight D'lorio. In the Intermediate Division first place went to James Weil, second place to Bill Smith, and third place to Mark Oppenheim. In fourth and fifth place were Mike McCarthy and Tim Denney. In the Senior Division first place went to Phil Oppenheim, second place to Jim Hessberg, and third place to Don Slingerland. Chris Dalton and Phil Soumerai won fourth and fifth place. The Citizenship Awards, presented to a camper in each division who best exemplified the spirit of good citizenship, friendliness, sportsmanship, and example. Phil Oppenheim received the Donald S. Candlyn Trophy. Mark Oppenheim won the Citizenship Award in the Intermediate Division, and Noah Kislevitz won in the Junior Division.

1968 SAILING CLINIC

As you might have realized, the Sailing Clinic begins the afternoon of the day camp classes and goes through Sunday afternoon. RACQUETTE RIVER TRIP

Early on Monday morning, July 22, Cabin Eight and Nine (Stephen Balog, Chris Dalton, Jim Hessberg, John Humphrey, Marc Navon, Brian Rush, Richard Bierau, Doug Flagle, Mitchell Goldberg, Jon Kennedy, James King, Phil Oppenheim, and Peter Sorensen) headed for the depths of the New York Adirondack Lake Region. Putting in on Blue Mountain Lake, the five-day, eighty-three mile paddle was underway. The first day's paddle through Blue Mountain, Eagle, and Utowana Lakes, over a half-mile portage and up the Marion River to Big Island on Racquette Lake, was challenging as strong headwinds raised white caps on each of the lakes. Tuesday saw the traversing of Racquette Lake, another short carry to Forked Lake, the traversing of Forked Lake, a truck portage into Long Lake, and paddling of the first six miles of Long Lake. Wednesday covered only twelve miles, finishing Long Lake and commencing Racquette River, but included a rugged ride and a quarter-mile portage. A hard push on Thursday covered the remaining twenty-four miles of Racquette River, Simon Pond, and a six-mile paddle across Tupper Lake to a picturesque campsite, complete with waterfall showers, for a day and a half of relaxation and recreation before a final three-mile paddle Saturday on Tupper Lake to our pickup point. The boys who made the trip proved to be both excellent canoeists and campers. Not only did the trip provide a chance to visit some of the most beautiful country in the Northeast; the demands of such an outing supplied an opportunity for many of the boys to discover the extent of their own stamina and resources.

TRIBAL ACTIVITIES

Tribal council fires burned brightly as campers united to bring their Tribe to first place. Since the first council fire, each camper as a member of the Blackfoot, Cherokee, or Sioux Tribe had been pulling hard for his Tribe. The tribal Timlogs, the highlight of these activities for the season, were completed and presented as the last event for the three Indian tribes. This summer the Blackfoot Tribe was victorious, followed by the Cherokee in second place, and the Sioux Tribe in third place by only four points.

TRAVELS BEGIN SOON

It begins with a meeting of Camp Directors at the Marriatt Matar Lodge in Saddlebrook, New Jersey, on Friday evening the 8th. The plan is to return from Williamsport to Lake George before our next trip.
