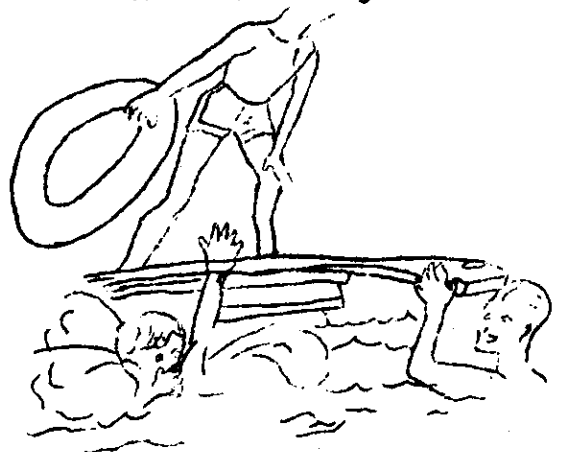

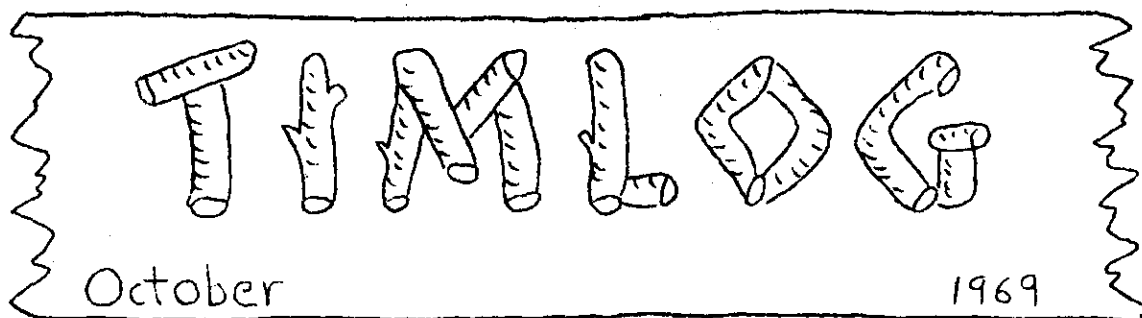

REVIEW SWIMMING, SAILING, AND TENNIS

COACH RUSSELL REVIEWS SWIMMING

In the opinion of the swimming staff the swimming program this year was one of the outstanding success story's at Timlo this camp season. We had 94 boys passing their American Red Cross classification test. The First 3 1/2 weeks the boys spent six days a week working on their swimming skills and as the season progressed we added water polo, Junior Life Saving under the direction of Tom Yeager, and water skiing.

One of the amazing facts is that 50% of our camp passed advance swimmer and since we are a sailing oriented group, I know that it's a great feeling for parents to know that their children should be able to handle all situations while on the water.

In my professional opinion we had an outstanding staff who worked hard to help your children improve their swimming skills.

Members of that staff are: Mike Huffman (Bucknell Varsity); Tom Yeager (Springfield College W.S.I.); Don Steighner (Grove City Varsity); George Spencer (Trinity College); John McFarland (Delmar H.S.); Roy Kurz (Massapequa H.S.).

We increased our water skiing time this year up to 4 hours a day and we were pleased to see many boys make excellent improvement.

TENNIS

The 1969 tennis program developed strongly under the skillful direction of Coach Dudley Hopkins and his assistants. The new tennis facilities, in operation for the second season, were extremely busy. In fact, in addition to the heavy use by campers, the courts often were filled during rest hour with members of the staff.

The senior tennis team was undefeated including one tie. The senior over-all meet record was 6 to 0. The strong senior tennis team members included Tom Lonergan (8-1), Charles Duguay (4-1), Rick Pivrotto (6-1), Amos Hutchins (4-0), Phil Soumerai (5-0), and Bill Smith (1-0). The figures in parenthesis represent the individual records in intercamp tournaments. The well balanced team included Chris Dain (2-0), Barney Solomon (7-2), James Weil (3-2), Mark Oppenheim (5-0), R. B. D'Iorio (0-2), Brad Berlin (0-2), Grant Swados (1-1). Their record was 5 and 1. The schedule included tournaments with the Lake George Club twice, Forest Lake Camp twice and Camp Chingachgook. At the end of the season the two campers at the top of the tennis ladder in the senior and junior division respectively, were Tom Lonergan and Mark Oppenheim. Special recognition went to Brian Pitnick, Barney Solomon and Tom Lonergan.

SAILING

The sailing season at Timlo this year was quite successful and the program in many respects was similar to the approach employed for the past many seasons. There was emphasis on racing as an effective way to develop sailing ability. The races stirred great interest as shown by the more than 750 ribbons awarded. Our constant practice paid off in competition with other camps and yacht clubs. Timlo was beaten only twice in nine meets, both times by close scores. The more usual situation found us rolling up big leads. The highlight of the season was our 2-0 record against traditional foe, the Lake George Club. It's also worth noting that more campers participated both as skippers and as crews than ever before, culminating in the awarding of some 35 sailing team patches at the last campfire. The sailing trip took an entirely new turn this season as we split the group, sending the older and more advanced sailors North to the Lake George Narrows and on to Sabbath Day Point. At the same time the traditional sailing trip to Long Island along Lake George took place. Whereas we had some rain, there was a good wind and we had a fine time.

The end of the season awards featured 150 patches for various ranks, the 750 ribbons mentioned above, and five trophies and plaques. The Junior trophy went to Mike Finnerty, the Most Improvement Sailor prize to Cameron Gough, the Racing Record award to Larry Thal. A special plaque was awarded CIT Peter Commette for a fine job teaching sailing, and the Outstanding Skipper trophy went to Andy Klein.

TRAVELS

Travels begin in early November. The heavy trip schedule for visiting campers and families and attending the various camp reunions doesn't get underway until after the 1st of the year. There is a brief trip planned which will stretch from Lake George to Virginia. The first stop is in northern New Jersey to attend a Camp Directors Roundtable meeting November 7th. The next eight days following will take us from northern New Jersey to Virginia and return to Lake George. We are looking forward to at least visiting on the telephone with families within these areas.

During these in-person or telephone visits we hope to uncover news of campers' activities for the Tim-Logs.
