ALL RUNS UNEARNED

All three runs scored in the Sirocco-Twist Drill game were unearned. Twist Drill outhit the Sirocco squad, 8-7, but Nick Belchuk earned the pitching decision over Andy Valcke. Emil Genga and Joe Fairhurst, both of Twist Drill, socked out two hits each.

Don MacEwan's pitching and Nick Sajatovich's hitting featured Walkers' win over the Firemen. MacEwan hurled a nifty five-hitter, striking out 10 and walking two. Sajatovich poled out three hits in four tries, including a bases-empty homerun in the sixth. Bob Wylupek also connected for the circuit in the second.

FAZEKAS HOMERS

Kozak Bros. outhit Fraser Lumber by a wide 9-5 margin, but the Lumbermen made the most of their scant collection of safeties to beat Garnet (Chow) Thorne. The win-

West End, with Gord Haldy starring on the mound, made a successful debut in the Windsor Centennial League last night, tripping Fire Department, 5-3, at Wilson Park.

DRILLERS REBOUND

Dominion Twist Drill rebounded from a 2-1 opening-game setback at the hands of Canadian Sirocco to sock Kozak Bros., 7-4, at Lanspeary Park.

The games marked the second straight defeats for both the Firemen and Kozaks.

Haldy struck out seven and walked two as he tamed last year's Industrial League champions. He yielded only five hits, two of them from the bat of Norm Callery, and saw his mates score two unearned runs in the last half of the eighth inning to break a 3-3 deadlock.

HAIDY HURLS THREE-HITTER FOR WEST END

Gord's Sparkling Work Backs 7-0 Triumph; Firemen Win, 6-2

West End soared into sole possession of first place in the new Centennial Softball League last night as Gord Haidy pitched a steady three-hitter to blank Hiram Walkers, 7-0, at Rossini Park.

Fire Dept. won its first game in three starts, trimming the winless Kozak Bros. nine, 6-2, at Wilson Park and Canadian Sirocco battled Fraser Lumber to an 8-3 tie with darkness halting play at Memorial Park after 10 innings of red-hot action.

BEST LOOP RECORD

The West End nine now has won two games and lost none, best mark of the seven teams in the classy senior circuit. Fraser Lumber and Canadian Sirocco have won one game each in addition to their tie.

Haidy, who pitched a brilliant five-hitter on Wednesday night, was in even better form in his second start. The three hits off him were all harmless singles and he struck out nine while walking one. His teammates backed him up with an eight-hit attack which featured homeruns by Jack Forrest (with one mate aboard) and Don Ethier (with the bases empty).

Only two Hiram Walker base-runners reached third base safely and both of them got there only with the aid of West End errors.

LANGLOIS IN CONTROL

Paul Langlois' steady six-hit pitching snapped the Firemen out of their two-game slump. Although he didn't strike out a single batter and didn't issue any bases on balls, he was an easy winner in his mound duel with the veteran Garnet (Chow) Thorne.

Langlois' supporting cast presented him with five big runs in the first inning and the issue was decided early. Pacey homered for the winners while Robinet hit for the circuit for the losers. Both four-baggers came with the bases empty.

Homeruns featured the tie game between Canadian Sirocco and Fraser Lumber.

ZALBA, ADAM HOMER

Harry Zalba, who hurled all the way for the Sirocco squad, socked a bases-empty four-bagger in the top half of the ninth inning to give his team an 8-6 lead. Norm Adam, Fraser Lumber second sacker, poled out a circuit clout in the last half of the same inning to help tie the score and send the game into extra innings.

New Softball Rule

Hit Batter to Go to First

Art Ray, president of the Windsor Umpires' Association, today issued a statement regarding the new hit-by-pitcher rule in softball.

OTHERS ADVANCE

The rule states:

"A batter, being struck by a pitched ball, who makes a sincere effort to avoid the pitch, shall be awarded first base and any other runners shall advance without prejudice."

Ray said that if the ball strikes the ground before hitting the batter, the pitch is to be ruled

a "ball" and no base shall be given to the batter.

If the batter does not make a sincere effort to avoid the pitch, the play is a "dead ball," but the batter does not receive a base.

TIME NOT CHARGED

When a batter is hit by a pitched ball and is awarded first base, the other base runners will advance only when forced to vacate the base they held and will be entitled to the next base.

An error is to be given to the pitcher and the batter is not charged with a time at bat.

Sports Chatter

THERE is no place in any sport for rowdiness and disorderly conduct so we can't blame those people who are disturbed by recent reports of such goings-on in local softball.

Twice in the past couple of weeks, there have been serious rhuarbs involving members of the Windsor Umpires' Association and players. The disturbances aren't doing the popular summer-time sport any good.

The first act of rowdiness to be brought to our attention took place two weeks ago in the Windsor Centennial League and, we're happy to report, officials of that circuit acted promptly to punish the guilty parties who took part in the fracas.

During a close game between Dominion Twist Drill and West End A.C. at Wilson Park, Jack Forrest, hot-tempered young short-stop with the West End team, was called out by Umpire Bill Andrews as he attempted to steal second base. With only one run separating the two rivals, Forrest's run meant a lot to the West End nine and when he was thumbed out, a first-class rhuarb broke out.

★ ★ ★ ★ ★

THEY say that the fracas lasted for nearly 15 minutes. When order was finally restored, not only Forrest was ejected from the game but Gord (Wild Man) Haidy, ace pitcher for the West End team, and his battery-mate, Jim Mousseau, were also chased from the premises by Umpire Andrews.

The Centennial League, as we said before, took speedy action to punish the trio of disorderly players.

Forrest, who "manhandled" the umpire and was the central figure in the lengthy debate, was handed a stiff five-game suspension by league officials. Haidy and Mousseau got off a little easier, receiving only one-game banishments.

A MORE recent outbreak of disorderly conduct, an even more violent display than the aforementioned "Forrest Incident," took place this past Monday night in a Regis Club Softball League game at Memorial Park.

Here's the story on that one as we got it from Art Ray, president of the Windsor Umpires' Association:

"Tony Koski was working a game between St. Theresa and St. Michael's and during the second inning, he warned a St. Michael's player about throwing his bat. This player, whom we will not identify until his punishment has been handed out, continued to feud with Umpire Koski for the next four innings. Finally, in the seventh inning, Koski asked this player to give him the ball so he could look at it. The player threw the ball to the ground and kicked it toward the official.

Koski promptly ejected the player from the game and finally forfeited the game to St. Theresa.

Moments later, when Koski was leaving the park, he was attacked and slugged by a supporter of the St. Michael's team and a general brawl broke out. Several players from St. Michael's team also got into the disturbance and Koski was the target of several well-aimed punches before he escaped to safety."

WE understand that this disorderly outbreak will be dealt with at a special meeting of the Regis Club League this evening. We hope that the player or players who took part in this disgraceful exhibition will be severely punished. Even a year's suspension shouldn't be too stiff a penalty for the central figures in this action.

Severe penalties for players who insist in feuding with umpires should be a "must." Umpires in softball and baseball, just like referees in hockey, basketball and football, are hired to do a job and although they often make some "bad calls" during a game, there is no reason for any violence.

Players should remember to forget those "bad calls" until after the game and then a written protest should be filed with both the executive of the league and the umpires' association. The results are usually gratifying.

WE can't blame the Canadian Sirocco team if it wishes that it had never seen the Windsor Centennial Softball League.

One year ago now, the Sirocco squad was rated as one of the top softball outfits in the city. A glance back through our files showed us that Al Brightmoor's outfit was leading the Industrial Softball League at this time last season with an impressive 14-7 record.

Today, with practically the same team, Sirocco is mired in the cellar of the new Centennial League with only three victories to show for 16 starts.

Dominion Twist Drill, on the other hand, is doing just as well in the Centennial League as it ever did in the Industrial loop. The Twist Drillers spent most of the '53 season in either first or second place in the Industrial circuit. Today, they're in second place in the Centennial League, just one game behind the leading Hiram Walkers nine.

Meloche, Haidy Ejected From Game For Abusing Umpire Chuck King

West End protested the action of Umpire Chuck King who, in the top of the 15th inning of the fifth and deciding game of a best-of-five title series, ejected two West End players, Pitcher Gord Haidy and Catcher Dick Meloche, from the game and finally awarded the game to Walkers.

The West End team had contended there was still a great deal of doubt as to whether Umpire King had actually tossed the two players from the game.

At last night's meeting, however, the reports from Umpire King and his two base umpires, Groulx and Sampson, proved that King had ejected the two players. It was further clarified that King warned the West End team to clear the field and continue the game. When the warning was not heeded, King officially awarded the game to Walkers by a 9-0 score and the Distillers were the new Centennial League champions.

The rule book backed up King's decision.

Haidy and Meloche were given the gate following a rhubarb with King over a decision at home plate. King called Norman (Lefty) Garant "safe" when the Walkers' player scored from third base following a foul fly to right field. The run gave Walkers a 3-2 lead in the top of the 15th.

Both Haidy and Meloche took exception to King's ruling, promptly charged him and pinned him against the backstop. Finally, he ordered the two players from the premises and when order was not restored, forfeited the game. He had to be given police protection until he reached his automobile.

When the true facts of the case came out at last night's meeting, Jim Mousseau, representing the West End team in the absence of Manager Harry Dowhan, congratulated Ross Newitt, Hiram Walkers pilot, on his team's victory. Dowhan also sent along his congratulations from a hospital where he is recovering from an illness.

"I regret," Mousseau proclaimed, "that such a successful and thrilling season had to end with a rhubarb such as this. However, the matter is all straightened out now to everybody's satisfaction and the best team has been declared as our first champion."

League Secretary Jack Davenport was chairman at the meeting since President Mousseau stepped from the chair to represent the West End team of which he is a member.

Also present at the meeting in addition to Mousseau, Davenport and Newitt were:

Bill Rogin and Lou Saddy, representing the Windsor Umpires' Association; Jim Hawkins, Western Ontario Scorers' Association; and five other league managers, Gerry Parent of Dominion Twist Drill,

Gerry Dawson of Fire Department, Moe Gleason of Kozak Bros., Al Brightmore of Canadian Sirocco and Ivan Meloche of Fraser Lumber.

The league will hold its first annual banquet at Casa Romana Hall, Seminole at Albert, two weeks from tonight, Wednesday, October 20. The Dominion Twist Drill Trophy will be formally presented to Hiram Walkers at that time.

Larder Lake Cops Title In Sweep of Choristers

Larder Lake Lions celebrated Thanksgiving Day by winning the 1954 Ontario Amateur Softball Association bantam championship at Lanspeary Park.

The Northern champions swept both ends of a doubleheader from Windsor Sacred Heart Choir by identical 6-2 scores to capture the best-of-three title series, 2-1. The Choristers had taken a 1-0 lead by winning the series opener on Saturday, 4-2, also at Lanspeary Park.

It was the North's first conquest of O.A.S.A. bantam title honors.

Drillers Ordered to Play Stittsville Over Weekend

Dominion Twist Drill, awarded the Ontario Amateur Softball Association Senior "A" championship by forfeit last weekend, was ordered today to play host to Stittsville this weekend in a best-of-three series for the title.

The announcement which ruled out the forfeiture of the series came from O.A.S.A. Secretary Frank Feaver of Hamilton.

Twist Drill Manager Gerry Parent, despite his feeling that his club was "getting the usual dirty deal from the O.A.S.A.," reluctantly agreed to play the series.

Last weekend, it appeared that Twist Drill had won the O.A.S.A. Senior "A" crown by the forfeit route after Stittsville officials turned down offers to play the series either here or in Ottawa.

Twist Drill guaranteed Stittsville \$200 to play the entire series in Windsor, but the bid was turned down. Later, Twist Drill offered to go to Ottawa for \$300 to play the entire series and Stittsville snubbed this arrangement, too.

Finally, Art Ray, district convener for the O.A.S.A., after a series of long-distance telephone calls, gave Stittsville until midnight last Friday to make a move in one direction or another. The deadline passed with no word from the Easterners and Ray announced that the series and the championship was being forfeited to Twist Drill.

Since that time, however, O.A.S.A. Secretary Feaver has stepped into the picture and ruled that the series must be played this weekend in Windsor.

"The O.A.S.A.'s pulling another fast one on us," Twist Drill Manager Parent commented after receiving Feaver's ultimatum. "Naturally, we're plenty burned up at the whole deal, but we've decided to play out the series to show our sponsors and the people of the City of Windsor that we've got the best ball club in the province."

Parent will have the same team ready for action which breezed past London, Goderich and Hamilton in preliminary O.A.S.A. Senior "A" playoff series.

Andy Valche and Ken Arrow-smith will be available for mound duty while Leo Delorenzi will toil behind the plate.

The starting infield will consist of Webo Biasatti at first base, Mike Robert at second, Ossie Davies at shortstop and Gus Angus at third. In the outer garden, it'll be Joe Fairhurst in left field, Emil Genga in centre and Mel Dunn in right.

Stittsville held a 2-1 lead after 5½ innings, but the Drill nine clinched the victory with a trio of markers in the last of the sixth.

Emil (Flash) Genga led off with a homerun to tie the count. Mel Dunn singled to left and took an extra base on Parks' error. After Fairhurst flied out, Ossie Davies poled out a two-run homerun to deep left field to give Twist Drill a two-run bulge. That was all the edge that Valche needed to secure the triumph.
