Windsor Softball League to Lift Lid Monday Four Foes Out to Dethrone Kane's

The Windsor Softball League, with its ranks reduced to five teams and wholesale player changes noticeable throughout, opens its 60-game 1996 schedule Monday night with a pair of games.

Martin House will face Dominion Twist Drill at Lanspeary Park while Canadian Sirocco meets Hiram Walkers at Shore Acres Park, the action starting in both fixtures at 6 o'clock.

Len Kane's, the fifth team in the circuit and the league's defending champion, will enjoy an open date but will face Martin House in its opener on Wednesday evening.

Kane's, Twist Drill, Sirocco and Walkers are hold-over teams from last season but player personnel has been shuffled plenty on all squads. Martin House is the only new entry, replacing the Fire Department and St. Anne's teams which have disbanded. Former players with both Firemen and St. Anne's are scattered throughout the circuit, however.

Managers for the four hold-over teams are the same. Harry Dowhan will pilot Kane's, Gerry Parent is set to handle Twist Drill, Al Brightmore has the reins of Sirocco and Ross Newitt will boss Walkers. Murrel (Eagle) Reid, who has been absent from the local softball scene for a number of years, will return as manager of Martin House. Reid piloted Meretsky and Gittlin to the O.A.S.A. Senior "A" championship back in 1945 and has long been regarded as one of the best managers in the district.

Each team will play 24 games and the regular schedule, barring postponements, will finish on July 23. The first four teams will qualify for the semi-final playoffs.

Here's how the teams shape up for the coming campaign:

MARTIN HOUSE

Ken Arrowsmith and Jack Gregg will share the pitching duties with Leo DeLorenzi behind the bat. The starting infield finds Stan Pinkowski at first base, Harry Soumis at

second, Russ Rudling at shortstop and Gord Plenderleith at third. Joe Fairhurst, Dan Daneliuk and Lou Nadin are the top outfield prospects with

Gerry Dawson, Jack Pacey and Tom Simpson as capable reserve players. Arrowsmith, Pinkowski, Plenderleith and Nadin played with Kane's title-winning team a year ago. Gregg, Soumis, Dawson, Daneliuk and Pacey are ex-Firemen while DeLorenzi, Fairhurst and Simpson formerly played with Twist Drill. Rudling, a Windsor native who moved to Hamilton a few years back, is marking his return to city league competition.

TWIST DRILL

The accent is on youth for the Drillmen this season and the bulk of Gerry Parent's team features ex-junior stars. Bill Chudyk and Wally Parent will handle the pitching with Ron Hunt behind the plate. The No. 1 infield combination finds

Bucky Parent at first base, Mike Robert at second, George Mahler at shortstop and Arnie McCallum at third. Don Rideout, Murray Cameron and Gord Waffle will patrol the outer gardens. Bob Reid, Bill Riggs, Jon Rideout and Norm Callery offer reserve power. Of this squad, only Chudyk, Parent, Robert, Don Rideout and Waffle played with Twist Drill last season. Callery is an ex-Fireman but the rest of the club played junior ball a year ago.

CANADIAN SIROCCO

Andy Valche, former Twist Drill pegger, replaces Harry Zalba on top of the pitching staff while Nick Belchuk and Herman Boyle are other first-line flingers. Boyle is a recent arrival from the Maritimes. Either Frank Mousseau or Willie Ulicny will handle the catching chores and the infield consists of Al DeLuca, last year's league batting champion, at first base, Carl Evon at second, Earl Keyes at shortstop and Gus Angus, ex-Twist Drill star, at third. Steve Sobocan, Bill Bridgeman and Andy Sokol will patrol the outfield. John MacDonald, Jock Papineau, Del Rizzi and Vince Sobocan form the Sirocco "bench."

HIRAM WALKERS

Don MacEwan and Cal Pearson are back to head the pitching staff and Paul Langlois has joined the Distillers from the defunct Fire Department nine. Ross Newitt and Wilf Magone will split the back-stopping chores while the infield offers chances for Knobby Gilbert, Wilf Smith, Earl Smith, Bob Wylupek, George Grant, Nick Sajatovich and Don Long. Neil MacEwan, Lefty Garant and Mel Dunn are first-line fly-chasers. Medo Martinello and Ron Wilson fill out the roster.

LEN KANE'S

The starry battery of Pitcher Gord Haidy and Catcher Dick Meloche will lead Kane's in quest of its second straight title. Haidy, in fact, is the only pitcher now listed on the Kane's roster. Webo Biasatti, former Hiram Walker player, will be at first base, Norm Adam at second, Len Parent at shortstop and Ernie Magone at third. Emil (Flash) Genga, a refugee of the Twist Drill youth movement; Ted Zalba and either Ken Brooks or Abie Scott will patrol the outfield. Ron Martin is a utility infielder. In addition to Haidy and Meloche, Adam, Scott and Brooks are the only holdovers from last year's Kane's crew.

Pitchers Gord Haidy, Wally Parent Show Mid-Season Form

Len Kane's, 1955 champion of the Windsor Softball League, marked its debut into the 1956 title scramble last night by posting a 3-0 victory over Martin House at Lanspeary Park.

The night's other league fixture resulted in a shutout, too, with Dominion Twist Drill, runnerup to Kane's for the '55 title spoils, taking the measure of Canadian Sirocco, 6-0, at Wilson Park.

Gord Haidy, the league's leading pitcher last season, fired a sparkling three-hitter at Martin House, striking out 10 and walking none. Ken Arrowsmith, who pitched for Kane's last term, bowed to his ex-mates although he was nicked for only five safeties. He struck out seven and walked but one.

Kane's picked up an unearned run in the second when Norm Adam was safe on Harry Soumis' error, took second on Ernie Magone's perfect sacrifice and came home on Webo Biasatti's single to centre. In the third, a walk to Dick Meloche, a single by Haidy and Norm Adam's triple scored two more markers.

Wally Parent came up with a four-hit mound chore as Twist Drill whitewashed Al Brightmore's Canadian Sirocco squad. Parent struck out nine and didn't walk anybody while his supporting cast poled out a total of 11 hits off Herman Boyle, Nick Belchuk and Jim Millman. Parent, like Haidy, received errorless support. Sirocco played booted five times.

Bob Reid's base on balls and a triple by Mike Robert gave Twist Drill its first run in the second. A single by Arnie McCallum, a triple by Gord Waffle and a single by Reid produced two more markers in the third. A double by Bucky Parent and a single by Wally Parent scored the fourth Twist Drill run in the sixth and McCallum's bases-empty homer in the seventh highlighted a two-run outburst.

Al DeLuca, the league's 1955 batting champion, poled out two of Sirocco's four hits, McCallum, Robert, Bucky Parent and Wally Parent socked out two hits each for Twist Drill.

Softball League Hands Out 5-Game Suspension

As an aftermath of a bat-throwing episode last Tuesday evening at Stodgell Park, the Windsor Softball League's Board of Governors has suspended Ken Arrowsmith, star pitcher for the Martin House team, for five games.

The suspension was handed down yesterday following a special meeting of the league's executive body. The meeting also reinstated Tommy Simpson, a second Martin House player, who was ejected by Umpire Gireoux shortly after Arrowsmith had been chased. Simpson voiced some uncomplimentary remarks about Haidy. He also sat out Saturday's game but will be eligible to play tonight.

At the same time, the league executive warned all teams that further unsportsmanlike conduct, particularly personal remarks directed at any single player, will call for suspensions if they are reported. 

In a letter directed towards this corner (we're cleaning out the old mail bag today, it seems), Mr. Abramson writes:

"You can do a great deal to assist some 2,500 Windsor athletes. No doubt you are familiar with the fact that night sports are extremely popular throughout Essex County and western Ontario. Sarnia, Chatham and even such small communities as Amherstburg, Belle River and Dover Centre have floodlighting equipment which permits the use of their recreational facilities after dark. At the same time, a large city such as Windsor has only one floodlighted park, that being Wigle."

"Windsor teams, competing for provincial and Dominion laurels, have been handicapped time and again because of the fact that they are not accustomed to playing under floodlights. Our own Windsor Jets suffered from this handicap during the recent O.A.S.A. playoffs and I am sure that the same was true of the Windsor Police team which lost a no-run, no-hit game up at Stratford."

"I am certain," Mr. Abramson continues, "that the Parks Department should consider the great benefit which could be derived if lighting facilities were made available somewhere in the city."

"At a recent meeting of a number of individuals who have devoted so much time and effort in building up sports in the Windsor area, it was suggested that Lanspeary Park could prove to be the ideal location for any floodlights which might be installed. Certain electrical facilities are already available at Lanspeary Park and it would not involve a real big expense to install an adequate lighting system. It is my intent to campaign for these floodlights and I would appreciate any publicity assistance on this matter."

We're fully behind you in your campaign to obtain floodlights for Lanspeary Park, Mr. Abramson, but don't get too enthused about such prospects. Similar movements have started before but we're still playing our softball under nature's light.

INCIDENTALLY, they could have used those floodlights last night at Lanspeary Park when Len Kane's hooked up with Canadian Sirocco in the third game of the Windsor Softball League final. It was mighty overcast 'round about 7 o'clock when Gord Haidy roared home from third base on an infield out to give Kane's a 3-2 11-inning victory over the game but outgunned Sirocco squad.

Kane's, the league's defending champion, has taken a commanding 3-0 lead in the best-of-seven title series and nobody, including most of the rabid Sirocco supporters, can see how the Haberdashers can blow the series now.

Kane's, with Haidy continuing to shine on the mound could easily sweep the series when the fourth game comes up Friday evening at Wilson Park. Here's a team which has yet to taste defeat in seven playoff starts against Dominion-Twist Drill and Sirocco. Sirocco did manage to force out a 2-2 11-inning deadlock in a game played last Sunday.

There's little doubt that some of Kane's six victories in playoff competition to date have been "cheap," the direct result of pitching and fielding mistakes by the opposing teams. All the wins look the same in the record book, however, and few softball fans can dispute the fact that Kane's, when Mr. Haidy is pitching, is THE BEST.

WHILE Kane's has been rampaging through the Windsor League ranks, Joe Grondin's Duplate Glass nine has been roaring out of control through the rival Manufacturers' League, this city's second-ranking softball circuit.

When Duplate whipped Canadian Bridge, 10-2, in the opening game of the Manufacturers' League final Tuesday, it marked that team's 23rd victory in 24 starts. Nobody's betting that this series won't be decided in straight games, too.
