Local 240 clicks in Metro debut

Thanks to a couple of infield hits and the wildness of North Star Lodge hurlers, Local 240 posted a 5-3 victory as the Metro Softball League debuted at Lanspeary Park Tuesday night.

A three-run blitz in the top of the seventh overhauled a 3-2 lead North Star had built up in the bottom of the sixth. Tom Awad and Emil Therriault ignited the rally by beating out raps to short.

After North Star starter and loser Rick Dinham walked Ron Bordeau intentionally, Henry Davis was called in with the sacks full and one out.

Local 240's Larry Lefaive worked Davis for a walk, forcing in the tying run, and Davis tossed a wild pitch to let Therriault score with the winner. Bordeau also crossing the plate with an insurance tally when North Star catcher Rollie Jones fired wildly in trying to nail Therriault.

Don St. Pierre slugged a two-run homer for Local 240 in the second before North Star came back in the third with a pair of runs on consecutive singles by Sheldon Taylor, Mel Carter and John Perry, plus a wild pitch by Bill Chudyk.

Perry's single and a three-base error by Local 240 left-fielder Awad lifted North Star into a 3-2 edge after six, but the edge was shortlived.

Calcot wins first International game

Windsor Calcot Hotel, who under the Unique Business Systems banner won the International Fastball League championship in 1966, picked up Saturday night right where it left off.

Abie Scott's Windsor nine started their 1967 IFL campaign in perfect style by whipping Detroit Alvito in a double-header at the Stadium, 1-0, in 10 innings and 6-1, behind the sparkling pitching of Gary Nolan and Bill Noble.

Nolan tossed a one-hitter in the opener while Noble, who threw a no-hitter last week in an Allan Park League appearance by Calcot, spaced three hits effectively in the seven-inning nightcap.

Nolan, who fanned 12, faced only 31 batters in the opener. He walked Harold Long in the seventh and Jim Usher singled to deep short in the eighth but was wiped out trying to steal second.

The winning run came off loser Tom Reeds unexpectedly in the 10th when Roger Awad walked and moved to third as Alvito third-baseman Long fired badly to first on Jim Stannard's grounder. Gord Plenderleith promptly singled to centre, his third hit, to bring in the necessary tally.

Noble clinched his own game in the nightcap with a two-run homer following John Marcinko's RBI single in the second frame. A triple by Evans Telegadas and Gord

Haidy's double brought in two more for good measure in the third.

Noble fanned only four while walking two but got excellent support.

Matthews blast to top

With one extra-inning burst, Matthews Confectionary moved into first place in the Metro Softball League Monday night.

In thier first start of the season, Matthews erupted for four runs in the top of the 10th and went on to whip Local 240, 6-2, in the second game of a Windsor Stadium double-header.

In the opener, North Star Lodge levelled their record at 1-1 with a 3-2 triumph over Silverstein-Zakoor Produce which also was making its league debut.

Local 240 (1-1) took its first loss in the somewhat-incredible nightcap which saw three runners thrown out at the plate in the last 1½ innings of regulation time before Matthews expolded in the 10th.

The big rally came at the expense of Bill Chudyk who walked a man and hit another to load the bases after Phil Hebert's one-out infield single. Jack Forrest ripped a single for two runs. Red Lambie lofted a sacrifice fly for another and got credit for two runs batted in when Forest scored all the way from second base after the catch.

In the seventh with the score tied 2-2, Don Fields of Matthews was ruled out at the plate because of interference by the batter against Local 240 catcher Bob Oglan. Lambie was retired in the ninth trying to score on a wild pitch when Oglan flipped to Chudyk covering.

Meanwhile, Matthews' Dave McClelland fired a perfect strike in the bottom of the 8th to nail Chudyk coming home from second on Emil Therieault's single. And, in the bottom of the ninth, another wierd play cost Local 240 the decision.

With Ron Bordeau on third, Jerry Grabowski rapped a drive off third baseman Gary Quenneville's leg. But Matthews' shortstop Jerry Kuzak

grabbed the carom and fired home in time to catch Bordeau sliding in.

Joe Budinsky, who struck out 12 in pitching a six-hitter, was the winner.

Sheldon Taylor's two-run homer over the left-field fence was the difference in the opening game.

It came in the bottom of the

eighth against Sam Sisco who had relieved Jack Westlake to start the inning. Sam got two men out before Dave Millben singled and Taylor followed with his homer.

Rick Dinham who went the distance was the winner on a sharp four-hitter. Westlake had given up only four hits and an unearned run through

Argo Cleaners bomb Belanger

Dick Drouillard's three-run homer capped a five-run explosion in the third inning and Argo Cleaners defending Metro Softball League champions, went on to register a 7-1 victory over Belanger Contractors Tuesday night.

It was the first action of the season for both clubs and Argo's Don Dominas outpitched Belanger's Hector Marinacci in the game at Lanspeary Park.

In Tuesday night's other game, Matthews Confectionery made it two straight by splurging for six runs in the fourth in downing Silverstein-Zakoor Produce, 10-1 at Wilson Park, the second consecutive loss for the Producemen.

Ted Czack fired a three-hitter for Matthews and struck out 11 without giving up a walk.

In the Argo-Belanger game, the Contractors left six men on base in the first three frames while playing to a 1-1 draw, then in the bottom of the third watched Argo sew it up.

A walk, an error and back-to-back singles by Bob Fraser and Gerry Sadai, the latter's a two-run blow, lifted Argo into a 3-1 lead, then after a two-out error by Belanger first-baseman Andy Vince, Drouillard blasted his three-run homer to centre to clinch the tilt.

Dominas tossed a six-hitter. He faced only the minimum 15 batters through the final five innings. Marinacci was touched for seven hits.

The Producemen carried a 1-0 lead into the fourth, but Matthews promptly broke it up with a six-run spree. Losing hurler Sam Sisco brought it all down on himself when he misplayed Jack Forrest's double play rap to the mound.

Larry Cascadden's triple, back-to-back doubles by Ron Desbiens, who had three rbi, and Don Fields, plus Jerry

Kuzak's single added three more runs for Matthews' in the eighth.

Czack was touched for two hits in the first inning and gave up Silverstein-Zakoor's lone run on a wild pitch, then allowed only three batters to reach base the rest of the way.

Dual no-hitters by Czack, Chudyk

... Ring Metro softball masterpieces

Thanks mainly to the no-hit artistry of Ted Czack and Bill Chudyk, the race for the final three playoff spots in the Metro Softball League today is as tight as a drum.

Czack, the veteran Detroit-er, and Chudyk, the experienced LaSalle resident, authored the first dual no-hitters in many years of city softball Thursday night.

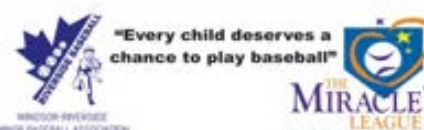

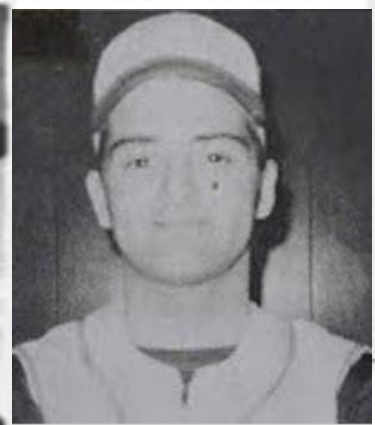

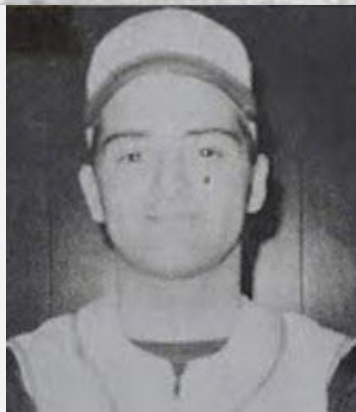
