Noble, Nolan tough on Sarnia

Bill Noble and Garrie Nolan displayed some superb pitching as the Windsor Fastball Club opened the International Fastball League season Friday evening with a doubleheader sweep over the Sarnia Glis, 4-1 and 1-0.

Noble struck out four in a four-hitter in the opening game at Windsor Stadium and then Nolan came on in the second to fan 12 while issuing no walks in a three-hitter.

Nolan's counterpart Joe Adams allowed only two hits and both pitchers had shutouts going until Windsor pushed across the winning run in the bottom of the seventh.

With one out in the seventh, Chris McCaffrey walked and Mike Lessard moved in as a pinch runner. Lessard took second on a wild pitch by Adams, his only one of the game, and then scored on a single to right by Ted Schroeder with two out.

Nolan, for his part, allowed one hit in the first and another two in the fourth. Noble had a little more breathing room to work with in the first game with Windsor scoring once in the first inning and adding two in the third and another in the sixth.

Sarnia opened the scoring in the first when Larry Lucas doubled, advanced to third on a ground ball and then scored on a sacrifice by Carl Beach.

Noble then shutout the Glis for the remaining six innings while his teammates went to work on losing pitcher Larry Forbes.

Tom Hannon was hit by a pitch to lead off Windsor's half of the first, moved to second on a walk to Earl Dafoe and then scored on a error by leftfielder Gino Cicchini.

Hannon scored again in the third after a double by Roger Awad who then stole home after moving to third on a flyball by McCaffrey.

Windsor wrapped up the win in the sixth with Les

Johnston scoring the final run.

Double duty by Noble

Windsor Fastball Club collected three out of a possible four points from Merlin in International Fastball League play Tuesday night at Windsor Stadium.

Windsor recorded a 2-1 victory in the nightcap of a doubleheader after the two clubs had tied at 1-1 in their seven-inning curtain-raiser.

Windsor had opened its schedule last Friday with a doubleheader sweep over Sarnia and now has seven points in the 96point league.

Bill Noble, who struck out 11 and walked none, was the winning pitcher for Windsor in the second game with a nifty seven-hitter.

The loss went to Gary Mifflin who yielded five hits, struck out three and walked three.

Windsor scored both of its runs in the last half of the second inning after its first two batters had been retired. Bert Smith walled and Rick Weir singled him to third.

Smith crossed the plate on a passed ball and Weir scored what proved to be the game's winning run moments later on a wild pitch.

Back-to-back singles by Fred Slade and Rob Vandecqueye, a stolen base by Reg Howard (running for Slade) and Al Slade's sacrifice fly to left plated the lone Merlin run in the seventh.

Vandescqueye, with a pair of singles, was the only player in the game to hit safely more than once. Roger Awad had Windsor's longest hit, a first-inning double.

In the first game, Merlin scored its lone run in the first inning and Windsor replied with its lone marker in the second.

Garry Nolan was Windsor's starting pitcher but he was replaced after the first inning when he suffered a broken blood vessel in his foot. Noble toiled the final six innings.

Ivan Guy pitched the distance for Merlin.

Merlin scored its run when Gary Brown worked Nolan for a base on balls, moved to second on Keith Drew's perfect sacrifice bunt and scampered home on Ron Drummond's two-out single to centrefield.

With two out in the Windsor half of the second, Bob Schroeder doubled to left and scored on Rick Weir's single to left.

Schroeder collected two of Windsor's five hits. Drummond had two of Merlin's three safeties.

Bob Harper had two hits, including a solo homer, for Branch 143, now 2-1. Rick Weir also had two hits for Legionnaires in the Wilson Park game.






The victory lifted Walker's (8-1) into sole possession as R-B's dropped to 7-2.
