

Renaud's arm classy as ever

Gerry Renaud is up to his old tricks in the Greater Windsor Fastball League.

Renaud, who hurled Custom Brokers to a championship last season, allowed only three hits and struck out eight in leading the Brokers, now under the Westwood Tavern banner, to a 7-1 victory over Canadian Auto Stores at Shore Acres Park Tuesday night.

In other games, R-B Sports Truckers, who reached the final last season, were clipped by Hiram Walker 12-7 and Kristian Brothers hammered Hawkeswood Garage 16-3.

Westwood touched the Automen's Ken Morris for 11 hits, combining four of

them with an error and a walk for five runs in the third. Serge Casey and Gary Farfanick each stroked two-run doubles in the inning.
