Wellington Tavern edged Crescent Lanes Tavern 5-3 in the second game of the stadium doubleheader.

Defending champion Zuliani Glass nudged K & A Tool 4-3 at Shore Acres Park and Hiram Walker socked Frank Vetere's Pizzeria 6-1 at Curry Park.

Calvert's 8 Caboto Club 0
Jerry Mayea, who struck out nine and walked two, pitched a six-hitter for the Distillers (3-0). They managed 10 hits off losing pitcher Bob McMillan.

Frank Federico connected for three of those hits, all singles. Roger Deslippe and Joe Beneteau drilled two hits each, including a triple by the latter.

Girard Vigneux and Mike Ferencik had two hits each for Caboto which lost for the first time in three starts.

Calvert's was outhit and Thompson Sports-Ottawa Tavern had a 7-0 lead at one time.

But Calvert's is now the only unbeaten team in the Greater Windsor Fastball League after four Friday games.

Calvert's offset a first-class effort by Zuliani's Bill Bolton to record a 4-2 win at Amherstburg, their fifth straight this season.

Thompson's looked to have a lock on their fourth straight victory but Kelsey-Hayes had other ideas in the second half of a Windsor Stadium doubleheader. Kelsey outlasted Thompson's 10-9 after overcoming that early 7-0 deficit.

Egon Peters have up 13 hits but went the distance for the win, striking out nine and walking only one.

Rene Russchaert came up with the night's best-pitched game for Crescent (1-3) but lost. He had a two-hitter in a 1-1 tie against Larry Champ going into the 11th when two errors, a wild pitch and Bill Pengelly's double did him in.

Crescent came back in the bottom half for one run but Champ, who won a seven-hitter, struck out Dave Peters with the bases loaded to end the game and preserve Vetere's second victory in five starts.

Busschaert struck out 12 and walked just three and Champ struck out 10 and walked only one.

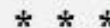
Police, Ottawa waging battle

Local sports roundup

Police continue stranglehold on Civic league standings

Hiram Walker 5 J. V. Carr 4

Police retained its stranglehold on first place in the Civic Fastball League by splitting a twinbill with runnerup Ottawa Tavern Monday night.

In the first game, Police won the completion of a suspended game 2-1 and then dropped the regularly-scheduled contest 5-2.

In the other game of the rare triple-header at Windsor Stadium, Hiram Walker edged J. V. Carr 5-4 in 10 innings.

The split left Police with a record of 13-4 while Ottawa Tavern is next best with 11 wins in 18 games. Hiram Walker holds down third place with a 7-10 record and J.V. Carr is in the basement, managing just four wins in 18 games.

Police had a 1-0 lead when the game was suspended after five innings because of darkness in June.

Ottawa got the one run back in the first inning of resumption (the top of the sixth).

John Hames, meanwhile, spun an eight-hitter, running into trouble only in the fourth and ninth when Police split six of their hit total.

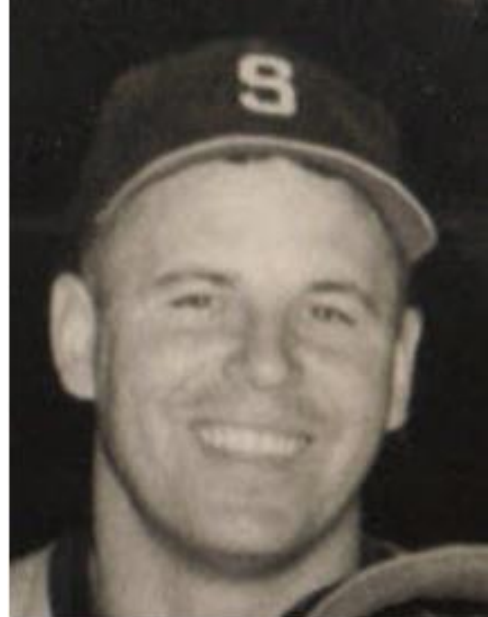
