Bill Bolton was the losing pitcher, giving up nine hits and four earned runs in 615 innings before yielding to reliever John Monahan.


Calvert's 7 Hiram Walker 1

He notes, though, that with all the rain last year there was a problem with diamond maintenance at Jackson Park on the holiday weekend.


"TURTLE CLUB, which has entered a team in all three tournaments, offered their facilities for this year's tournament and we were pleased to accept.
