The longest softball game

SAGINAW — (UPI) — Never has there been a longer softball game than the one played Tuesday night between teams from Midland and Madison, Wis.

Peter Finn, 20, went the entire 34 innings on the mound, striking out 64 batters to lift Midland to a 2-1 victory in the marathon seven-hour, 20-minute contest.

Finn, of Napanee, Ontario, allowed just nine hits. In one stretch, he retired 36 batters in a row without allowing a baserunner.

His opponent, 19-year-old Peter Meredith of New Zealand, also pitched the entire game. He allowed 11 hits and struck out 42 batters.

Madison scored the first run in the third inning and Midland Valley Mechanical Contracting tallied a lone run in the fourth. Thirty innings later, Midland scored the winning run on a single by David Bedford to score Art Tolfree, who had walked before advancing on a double.

International Softball Congress World Tournament officials, sponsoring the event which had

an original field of 41 teams, said the underhand fastpitch softball game was the longest ever.

The previous ISC record had been a 28-inning game. The rival Amateur Softball Association record is 31 innings.

Finn's 64 strikeouts broke the record of 44 set by Vern Mauch of Lamar, Colo., in 1967 at Rock Island, Ill.

Finn also set a record for most strikeouts in an ISC tournament. In three previous appearances this week, he struck out 34 batters, bringing his total to 98.

Finn said he had once pitched 17 innings when he was 16 but ended up losing 1-0. Obviously, he hoped he would not suffer a similar fate.

"You don't think you're going to make it," he said, "and then somebody on your team gets a hit, and you're all pumped up again."

In the bottom of the 34th inning, after Tolfree walked, Ken Gay doubled down the rightfield line just inside the foul marker, leaving runners on second and third with no outs. Bedford's clean single to right scored the winning run.

Winky Allen, who struck out seven and walked three, was the winning pitcher with a sharp two-hitter. Bill Bolton, who was nicked for six hits, took the loss.

A base on balls to Towers and Bolton's one-out triple produced East Side's first run in the fourth inning.

Ottawa Tavern tastes defeat

While Ottawa Tavern tasted defeat for the first time in this Greater Windsor Fastball league season Monday, Hiram Walker's is starving for its first win.

Ottawa is now 6-1 on the year after Calvert's edged the Tavernmen 5-4. Ottawa remains on top of the western division heap and Calvert's holds the same position with a 6-2 mark in the east.

In the only other game Monday, Ticket Wicket evened its record at 3-3 with a 7-4 victory over Walker's which is firmly ensconced in the western division basement at 0-6.

Calvert's 5 Ottawa 4
Calvert's scored all five runs on a six-hit explosion in the fifth inning. Joe Beneteau lead the way with a two-run single to right while teammates Mike Purdie, Jeff Long and Ray Holliday collected two hits apiece. Steve Hoar rapped an rbi single and a solo home run for Ottawa.

The Tavernmen chased Purdie from the mound in the first inning when they collected two runs on three hits. Holliday pitched the final eight innings, striking out nine, walking one and allowing three hits.

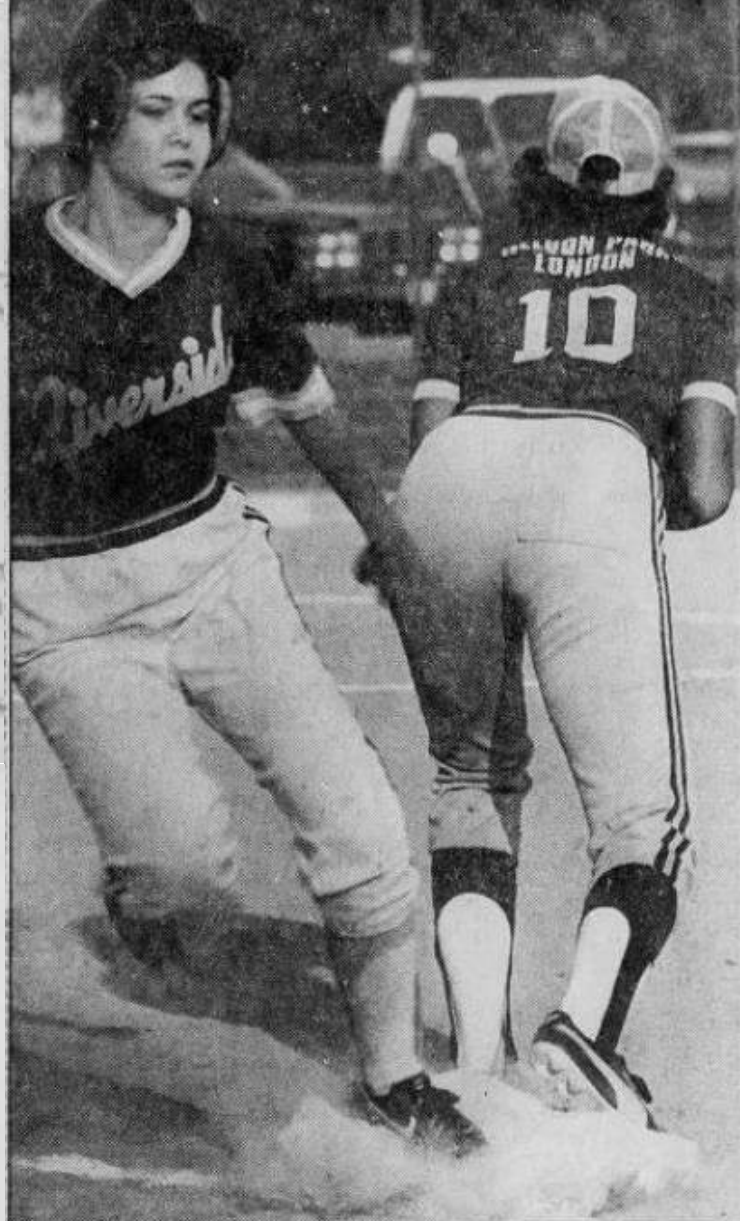
