

'Kiwi spirit' overcomes Canadian pitching ace

MIDLAND, Mich. (CP) — "We beat Canadian side on, but, as veteran first ourselves," Jim Cowdrey lamented. baseman Dan Donahue put it, "We

"When you lose 3-1 and you give up three hits, you've beaten yourself."

Cowdrey, ace of the Canadian pitching staff at the world softball championships, was looking back at the heartbreaking loss to New Zealand Saturday night in the final game of the 16country tournament, Canada's only loss in nine games.

All week, Canada's pitchers had shown astonishing mastery over rival hitters, hurling eight consecutive shutouts over 49 innings and striking out 100.

FOR HIS part, Cowdrey, a Toronto truck driver, had pitched two no-hitters — one of them a perfect game — leading to the championship game and had allowed only four hits in 24 innings. Of every 30 outs he recorded, 28 were by strikeout.

But the magic was gone Saturday night. Canadian bats fell silent against New Zealand pitcher Steve Jackson and the New Zealanders capitalized on a wild pitch by Cowdrey and a passed ball to score two of their three runs.

A partisan, near capacity crowd of more than 9,000 at Currie Stadium in this central Michigan town egged the

Canadian side on, but, as veteran first baseman Dan' Donahue put it, "We weren't sharp at all ... We let Jim down."

"WE HAVE the best pitching staff in the world," said Donahue, a Cambridge, Ont., resident playing in his sixth world championship. "We just weren't as high as we were supposed to be."

Cowdrey agreed that "we came up a bit flat." One possible reason, he said, was that Canada reached an emotional plateau in defeating the defending champion United States 4-0 in a semifinal game Friday. Cowdrey pitched that game, too, allowing only two hits and fanning 10.

The Canadians' frustrations came to a head in the fourth inning when, trailing 2-0, they loaded the bases with two out.

JACKSON FACED Grant Skinner of Ottawa at the plate.

"I was praying to the man upstairs," the New Zealand pitcher said. "I said please give me one more out."

Skinner lashed a sharp liner back to the Jackson — "He made a great play to get the ball," said Donahue — and the pitcher fired the ball to first to snuff out the Canadian rally.

Jackson went on to scatter four hits

and strike out two for the victory. Cowdrey gave up two hits; reliever Gene McWillie of Saskatoon yielded one.

New Zealand scored in the first inning when Mike Nichols walked, stole second and scored on a double by Ian Stringer.

THEY GOT another run in the third when pinch-runner Daryl Stratford, on first after Mark Sorenson's walk, moved around the bases on a sacrifice fly, a fielder's choice and a wild pitch thrown by Cowdrey as he tried to intentionally walk New Zealand's cleanup hitter.

Canada scored in the top of the sixth on a triple by Jim Jones of Conquest, Sask., and a sacrifice fly by Skinner.

New Zealand got that run back in the bottom of the sixth. Nichols tripled, chasing Cowdrey and bringing on McWillie, and came home on a passed ball.

New Zealand coach Mike Walsh said it was the "Kiwi spirit" that carried his players to the championship. They had ousted the defending champion United States 5-3 earlier in the day to get a crack at the title.

"WE SHOWED guts and determination," he said. "It's tremendous. It'll be a few hours, a couple of days, befere it sinks in."

New Zealand ended the tournament with a 8-1 record, while Canada also bowed out at 8-1.

Canadian coach Dave Pearce said his team goes home with no regrets.

"We didn't hit the ball and we didn't deserve to win," he said. "They seemed to get a guy on third at all the right times."

"That's the breaks of the game and the way New Zealand played was the story. We have no regrets."


