Comber winning

Amherstburg Seagram's climbed into the win column in Greater Windsor Fastball League play Monday night, but Comber Legion just kept on winning.

Seagram's blanked Blytheswood Royals 1-0 in 10 innings at Amherstburg to forge a three-way tie for fourth-place at 1-2 with Blytheswood and Johnson's-BFI, who lost 12-7 to Comber, 3-0, at Windsor Stadium.

A two-out passed ball ended this thriller when Frank Federico scored after reaching on an error and advancing to third on Jeff Long's single.

Bryce Taggart went the route for Seagram's on an 11-strikeout eight-hitter, stranding 10 Blytheswood runners. The loss went to Jim Tiessen, in four-inning relief of Pete Driedger. They combined on a 10-strikeout four-hitter.

Driedger and Harry Klassen had two hits each for Blytheswood.

Comber 12 Johnson-BFI 7

Legionnaires remained unbeaten, thanks to Vic Hamm, who belted three home runs, a single, a double

and drew a walk in driving in five runs.

Hamm homered to lead off the first, cracked another solo blow in the second and two-run shot in the third as Comber built up a 9-0 lead, also aided by Len Driedger's bases-loaded triple in the first.

Dick Segedin, with the early cushion, lasted through a 15-hit Combines' offence, to gain the pitching decision.
