

Windsor teams up for title

Local fastball squad jumps on opportunities

Windsor went back to the basics Sunday afternoon and it resulted in a provincial championship.

Slick fielding, timely hitting and the ability to lay down a sacrifice bunt when required led Windsor to a 9-2 win over Kitchener in the Provincial Women's Softball Association novice division championship game at Jackson Park.

"Fundamentals and basic softball have been part of our program all season," said Windsor manager Paul Layfield.

"You can run into some great pitching at this level so you have to run, bunt and steal to manufacture some runs. Our theory is to put the pressure on the opposition and force them to make the plays.

"If they do, well we tried but if they don't, it can add up to

some big innings."

And such was the case Sunday as Windsor struck for three runs in the first and added two more in each of the second and third innings to win handily.

The Kitchener squad, which finished with a 4-2 record, dropped a nine-inning 2-1 decision to Windsor on Saturday which relegated them to the loser's bracket.

But they battled back by defeating Unionville 9-0 Saturday afternoon before eliminating Brampton 7-3 and Chinguacousy 6-3 in a doubleheader immediately before Sunday's championship game.

"I DON'T LIKE making excuses for the girls because they played great all weekend, but we were mentally drained," Kitchener manager Bob Brenner said.

"We did what nobody else did here this weekend by fighting back from the loser's bracket, but I don't think we had anything left by the final.

"But I have to give Windsor credit because they made us pay for every mistake we made."

Those mistakes came early and often.

Wild pitches, passed balls, poor covering at the plate and dropped fly balls accounted for five runs as Windsor jumped out to a 7-0 lead after three innines.

"We knew they'd already played twice today so our plan was to put the pressure on early," said Windsor's Nicole Meloche.

"And we were able to take advantage of their mistakes when they happened," added Sarah Ryall. "That's the key — making a team pay for mistakes . . . not letting them off the hook."

Dana Tofflemire allowed just one hit in the championship game and, combined with Lindsay Hunnan, held the opposition to just four runs in three games during the tournament.

"Dana pitched a great game, obviously," Layfield said.
"But Lindsay is just as important to this team because, without her, we probably wouldn't have survived the regionals."

Layfield agreed that Kitchener had faced a difficult task over the weekend.

"They had to endure a long road and I know we'd have been in for a tougher time if they'd been fresh," he said.

IT MAY BE small consolation but the Kitchener squad swept the individual awards.

Catcher Kimberly Poulin was named most valuable player by virtue of her .978 field average, 41 putouts and 2.35 batting average.

Teammate Vicki Brenner was named top pitcher after finishing with a 3-1 mark, 34 strikeouts and 0.25 ERA.

Marci Janecek completed the sweep by winning the top hitter award for her .429 average, which included a triple and two doubles.

Meloche was runner-up to Janecek wiith a .417 average with five doubles and four RBIs.

"The fact we were shutout of the awards just emphasizes what I've been preaching all season." Lay-field said. "We have some great individuals but what makes us different is that we're an even bester team."
