In fact, at any one time all seven could be in the lineup. Dave Tramontozzi pitches, Ryan Wakeman plays first, Matt Seguin second, J.P. Chartrand catches, and Jayme Hall, Dean Foreman and Ryan Chase are outfielders.

"They all performed just excellent," Tuer said of the Ontario tournament. "The kids are pretty good ballplayers."

Steve Krsul at third and Ed Caston at shorstop fill out the starting lineup with Tom Firman, Kevin Cabana and Pat Grondin all expected to see plenty of action.

Windsor opened with a 5-4 loss in 11 innings against defending champion British Columbia Thursday and plays Quebec today. Others in

the round-robin tournament include the Prairies, Atlantic and the host team.

"From what I've seen, I think we'll make it to the final," Tuer said. "Most teams have some pretty big players and don't think we have a chance, but they'll show them on the diamond."

British Columbia is expected to provide the major competition with the top two teams advancing to the final.

"I think we'll make the final," Tuer said.
"The kids are performing just excellent."

It marks the third trip to the final in five years for Windsor. The all-stars were 2-3 as tournament host last year and 3-2 in 1988.

As for Windsor South's major girls, the onfield competition isn't the only challenge when you're 11 and 12.

"Right now it's tough because they're lonely," manager Mike Davidson said. "A few parents came down (for the Ontarios) and before they left there were a lot of tears.

"They sort of want to go home because half of them have never been away from home. It's tough on the manager and coach, too."

Coach Barry Fields is doing all he can.

"Barry keeps them up and takes care of

their problems," Davidson said. "Right now, they're excited to see the mountains."

Windsor got some revenge in the Ontarios by beating Ancaster, who defeated Windsor in last year's final.

Now, South will play against British Columbia, the Prairies and the host Calgary team. The winner of the double-knockout tournament moves on to the world series in Kalamazoo, Mich beginning Aug. 18.

"The kids are pumped and very excited to get going," Davidson said.

"We'll be okay if we get good pitching and defence. We made very few errors in the Ontarios."

Leslie Weinz and Leigh Anne Dowie will split the pitching and second base. Other starters include catcher Nicole Sbrocca, first baseman Cailin Bosnyak, shortstop Meredith Popp, third baseman Stephanie Stiller and outfielders Jennifer Fields, Natalie Taylor, Katie Muzzin and Shannon Bennett.

Windsor South falls short

B.C. pitcher dominates in Canadian final

CALGARY — For the second time in the tournament, pitcher Jodie Gacrett overpowered Windsor South batters, fanning 13 as Duncan, B.C. scored an 8-1 decision in the championship game of the Canadian Major Girls Little League softhall tournament in Calgary on Thursday.

"She's get to throw the ball 55 to 60 miles per hour," Windsor South manager Michael Davidson said of Garrett, who led Duncan to a 5-0 win over Windsor South earlier in the tourney.

That had been Windsor South's only tournament loss leading up to the final.

"With that pitcher, we knew we were in tough," Davidson said.

"She just dominates the hitters. We tried to do what we could to get people on base."

"We tried to bunt for hits, but their infielders moved in and took that

WINDSOR SOUTH managed just one hit and it led to the club's only run. Leigh Ann Dowie tripled in the fourth and scored on Meredith Popp's sacrilice bust.

"Basically, they took charge early," Davidson said.

Duncan got ahead in the game with four runs in the second inning. After Windser South narrowed the gap to 4-1, the B.C. squad locked up the national crown with a pair of runs in each of the fifth and sixth innings.

With the win, Duncan will represent Canada at the Girls Major Little League World Series in Kalamazoo,
