# Windsor South in national final

Windsor South will play for the Canadian Major Girls' Softball championship on Wednesday.

South earned the right with a 9-8 victory over the Prairies on Monday in Calgary.

"We had them down, but kind of slacked off," South manager Mike Davidson said.

Leading 8-6 in the sixth inning, the Prairies got two runs off reliever Leslie Weinz to tie the game.

South rebounded in the bottom of the inning as Leigh Anne Dowie came through with a bases-loaded, two-out single to win it. Weinz got credit for the win in relief of Stephanie Stiller.

Offensively, South got two hits and four RBIs from Meredith Popp, two hits and two RBIs from Cailin Bosnyak.

Now, Windsor moves on to face Duncan, B.C. in the final.

"The pitching out here is incredible," Davidson said. "Duncan's got a girl who is amazing and we get her in the final."

Windsor lost 9-0 to Duncan in its only meeting and also scored a 15-2 win over the host Calgary team.

"This is where you see all the competition," Davidson said. "These are supposedly the four best teams in Canada."

Weinz will get the call against Duncan on Wednesday.

"I really think it will be a much closer game," Davidson said.

The winner of the tournament travels to Kalamazoo, Mich. for the world series.

# Little League teams chase Canadian championships

Two teams face different challenges, but both hope to return to Windsor with a Canadian championship.

Windsor South is in Calgary for the Canadian Major Girls' Softball championship while the District Five all-stars are in New Waterford, N.S. for the Canadian Big League championship.

All-stars manager Mike Tuer and coach Jody Hall are anxiously awaiting their return to Windsor, but they're content to wait until the Canadian championship is over.

"I don't want to name names, but there will be a few people with egg on their face," Tuer said.

Tuer took a lot of heat when he took seven 16-year-old players to the Ontario championships for boys' 16 to 18.

"A lot of people said we wouldn't win a game," Tuer said. "Let me tell you, if we didn't

have those kids we wouldn't have won a game."

In fact, at any one time all seven could be in the lineup. Dave Tramontozzi pitches, Ryan Wakeman plays first, Matt Seguin second, J.P. Chartrand catches, and Jayme Hall, Dean Foreman and Ryan Chase are outfielders.

"They all performed just excellent," Tuer said of the Ontario tournament. "The kids are pretty good ballplayers."

Steve Krsul at third and Ed Caston at shortstop fill out the starting lineup with Tom Firman, Kevin Cabana and Pat Grondin all expected to see plenty of action.

Windsor opened with a 5-4 loss in 11 innings against defending champion British Columbia Thursday and plays Quebec today. Others in

the round-robin tournament include the Prairies, Atlantic and the host team.

"From what I've seen, I think we'll make it to the final," Tuer said. "Most teams have some pretty big players and don't think we have a chance, but they'll show them on the diamond."

"I think we'll make the final," Tuer said. "The kids are performing just excellent."

It marks the third trip to the final in five years for Windsor. The all-stars were 2-3 as tournament host last year and 3-2 in 1988.

As for Windsor South's major girls, the on-field competition isn't the only challenge when you're 11 and 12.

"Right now it's tough because they're lonely," manager Mike Davidson said. "A few parents came down (for the Ontarios) and before they left there were a lot of tears."

"They sort of want to go home because half of them have never been away from home. It's tough on the manager and coach, too."

Coach Barry Fields is doing all he can. "Barry keeps them up and takes care of

their problems," Davidson said. "Right now, they're excited to see the mountains."

Windsor got some revenge in the Ontarios by beating Ancaster, who defeated Windsor in last year's final.

Now, South will play against British Columbia, the Prairies and the host Calgary team. The winner of the double-knockout tournament moves on to the world series in Kalamazoo, Mich. beginning Aug. 18.

"The kids are pumped and very excited to get going," Davidson said.

"We'll be okay if we get good pitching and defence. We made very few errors in the Ontarios."

Leslie Weinz and Leigh Anne Dowie will split the pitching and second base. Other starters include catcher Nicole Sbrocca, first baseman Caitlin Bosnyak, shortstop Meredith Popp, third baseman Stephanie Stillier and outfielders Jennifer Fields, Natalie Taylor, Katie Muzzin and Shannon Bennett.

# Windsor South falls short

## B.C. pitcher dominates in Canadian final

CALGARY — For the second time in the tournament, pitcher Jodie Garrett overpowered Windsor South batters, fanning 13 as Duncan, B.C. scored an 8-1 decision in the championship game of the Canadian Major Girls Little League softball tournament in Calgary on Thursday.

"She's got to throw the ball 55 to 60 miles per hour," Windsor South manager Michael Davidson said of Garrett, who led Duncan to a 9-0 win over Windsor South earlier in the tourney.

That had been Windsor South's only tournament loss leading up to the final.

"With that pitcher, we knew we were in tough," Davidson said.

"She just dominates the hitters. We tried to do what we could to get people on base.

"We tried to bunt for hits, but their infielders moved in and took that away."

**WINDSOR SOUTH** managed just one hit and it led to the club's only run. Leigh Ann Dowie tripled in the fourth and scored on Meredith Popp's sacrifice bunt.

"Basically, they took charge early," Davidson said.

Duncan got ahead in the game with four runs in the second inning. After Windsor South narrowed the gap to 4-1, the B.C. squad locked up the national crown with a pair of runs in each of the fifth and sixth innings.

With the win, Duncan will represent Canada at the Girls Major Little League World Series in Kalamazoo, Mich.



Windsor South had posted a 2-1 mark in round-robin play, sandwiching a 15-2 Saturday win over the host Calgary South club and a 3-8 decision over the Prairies on Monday around its Sunday loss to Duncan.

Windsor South pitcher Leslie Weinz, the winning pitcher in both those round-robin triumphs, took the loss in the final, going the distance and allowing nine hits.

"I think maybe the pressure got to the girls a little bit," Davidson said.

The club was playing in the Canadian final in just its second year of Little League ball.

**POPP, WEINZ**, Dawie, Shannon Bennett and Jennifer Cajocari all played for the Windsor South team which lost in the Eastern Canadian major final last year to Ancaster.

They avenged that loss with a triumph over Ancaster in the Eastern Canadian finals last week in Perth.

"There were a lot of long faces and a lot of tears shed at the end," Davidson said.

"It's hard to get them to think ahead and realize what this will all mean to them years from now.

"It's been a really impressive run for a team which didn't have Little League to play two years ago.

"We told them they should be proud.

"They're the second-best team in Canada. That's not bad for a second-year team."
