The Wildcats will play in the provincial squirt division tournament at Ottawa, Aug. 6-8.

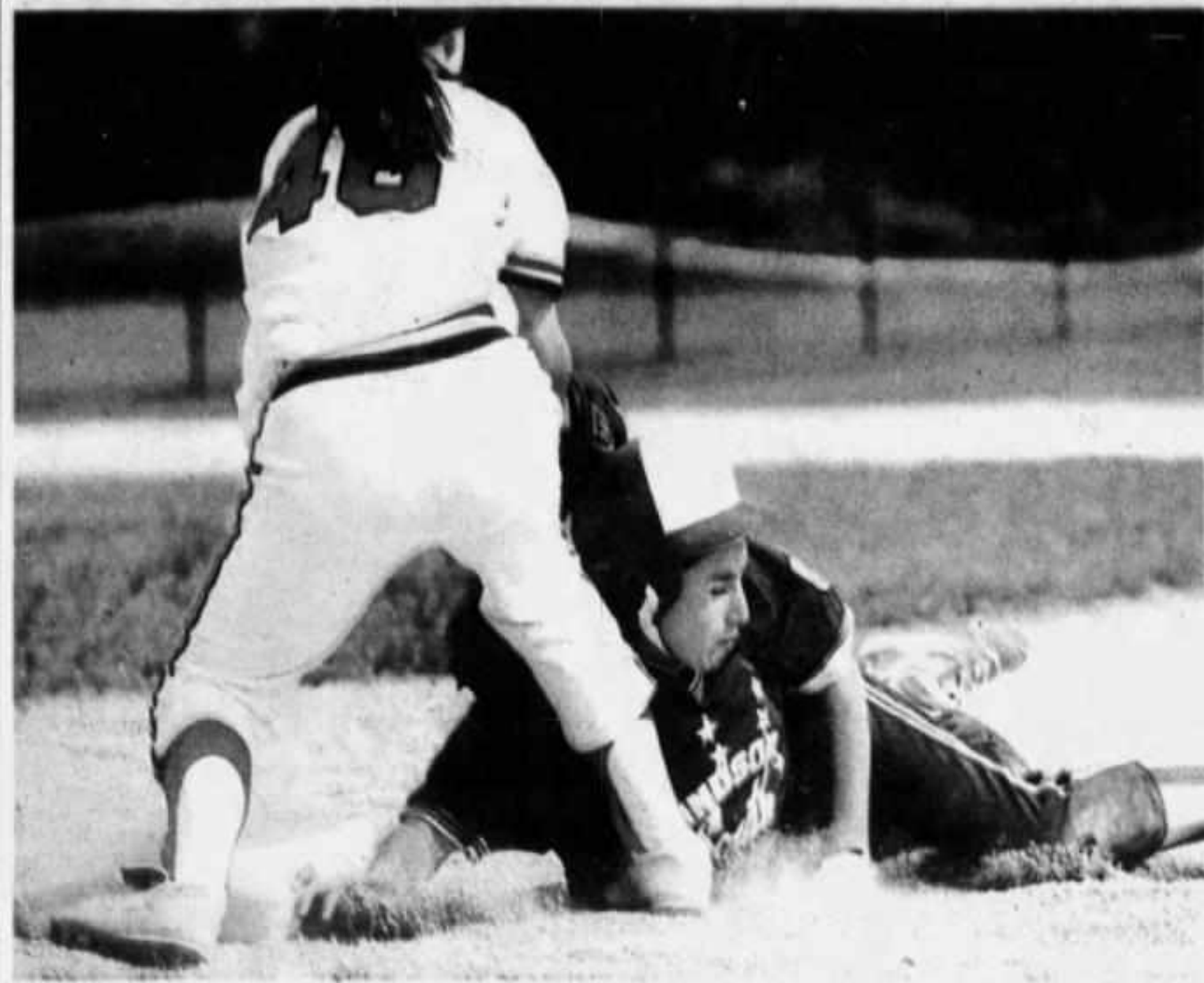
Softball: The Windsor Athletic Association Wildcats bantams came home with the title from the Summer Softball Spectacular in Waterford, Mich. on the weekend.

B.C. softball team walks to a win over Windsor South

Kim Harper has already won the hearts of umpires and fans at the Canadian Little League major softball championships at Optimist Park and the tournament has just begun.

Harper is the diminutive catcher for the Layritz, B.C. team which is 1-0 in the round-robin portion of the championships following a 19-18 victory over Windsor South Sunday night.

South is now 0-2 including another tight loss Saturday, 15-13 to Erindale.

In the Canadian senior division, South is also 0-2 with a 13-0 loss to Lakehill, B.C. Sunday and a 4-3 loss to Fort Erie Saturday.

AS DARKNESS closed in on the diamond Sunday night, Harper crossed the plate in the bottom of the sixth and final inning after a bases-loaded walk forced her home with the winning run.

At just four-foot-seven and 72 pounds, Har-

per was the smallest player on the field but one of its most animated.

Earlier in the game, when Layritz manager Mike Darby had an on-field discussion with pitcher Nicole Hancock, Harper joined him and offered Hancock a hug of support and the thumbs-up sign.

"She's our motivation out there," Darby said.

"This is the best thing to ever happen for Layritz ever," the 12-year-old decided after the win. Both sides were plagued by walks — 16 is-

sued to Windsor South and 17 to Layritz.

South came from behind to take an 18-16 lead into the sixth inning but couldn't hold it.

"TODAY THEY really tried to come back. They never seem to give up out there," South manager Gail Bowden said. "I think maybe they're almost trying too hard. They're trying to please everybody (in the stands). Now (at 0-2) they've got nothing to lose so maybe they'll loosen up for Tuesday's game."

Harper drove in two runs off two hits for

Layritz against South while teammate Brittany Spinelli drove in four runs with a pair of hits.

Natalie Taylor and Melissa Lovegrove each drove in three runs off a pair of hits for South which will play the Prairies Tuesday.

The Prairies, Layritz and Erindale are all 1-0 following weekend play.

In the senior division, Fort Erie tops the field a 2-0 with Lakehill, B.C. at 1-0.

South also plays the Prairies Tuesday in the senior division.

Wildcats: The Windsor Athletic Association Wildcats came home from the Ontario bantam girls softball championships in Mississauga with a third-place showing.

A 6-2 loss to Waterloo left Windsor one win short of reaching the final of the double-knockout tournament. London edged Waterloo 3-2 in the championship game.

Earlier on the weekend, Windsor had suffered its first loss, a 3-1 setback against London, but followed up with a 2-0 shutout of Cawthra and an 11-2 rout over Thorold.

For Windsor, pitcher Chantelle Seguin, who was 3-0 with a 0.67 earned-run average, was named the tournament's top hurler. At the plate, WAA's Dayane Rodrigues batted .500 and Jen Andrew hit .466.

Windsor downed Chatham 7-4 in the gold-medal game on Sunday. Earlier in the tournament, Tracy Lambert tossed a perfect game as Windsor blanked Sarnia, the eventual bronze medallists, by an 11-0 count.

Liz Tremaine led Wildcat hitters, batting .692, while Heather Bondy hit .667 for the tourney.

Windsor now advances to the Ontario championships, Aug. 27-28 in Sarnia.

Softball: Strong teams from British Columbia sit atop standings after impressive victories Monday at the Canadian Little League major softball championships.

In the major division, winning pitcher Nicole Darby led her Layritz, B.C. club at the plate, driving in five runs on four hits in a 18-9 win over Northwest Calgary. Layritz has a 2-0 record.

West best in girls' softball

The Canadian Little League Softball championships at Optimist Park proved one thing Thursday — the west is the best.

Teams from British Columbia won both the major (11-12 years) and senior (13-15 years) divisions at the nationals and will now advance to the worlds next week in Kalamazoo, Mi.

Lakehill, B.C. defeated Fort Erie 7-5 in the senior final while Layritz, B.C. took the major title with a 19-5 victory over Erindale.

The senior final was a well-played affair featuring the pitching of Lakehill's Erin Finlayson.

Finlayson completed a hat trick with Thursday's victory, having previously been the winning pitcher in the district and provincial championships.

"I'm always nervous before the game starts but after the first pitch that's gone," the 15-year-old righthander said.

Twice Finlayson was able to work her way out of a bases-loaded jam — the first time with the score tied 2-2 in the third and the second time with Lakehill holding a 4-2 lead in the fifth.

"Erin has been pitching since she was nine years old but in the last year and a half she's really started to come on," Lakehill manager Ron Danderfer said.

Finlayson gave up five hits, struck out three and walked seven in the final.

"It's a lot hotter here and the ball moves a lot differently," Finlayson said of the walks. "It rises straight up and it's hard to control."

In the third inning, Lakehill's Heather Reid cracked a two-run double that snapped a 2-2 tie.
