






Kim Harper has already won the hearts of umpires and fans at the Canadian Little League major softball championships at Optimist Park and the tournament has just begun.

Harper is the diminutive catcher for the Layritz. B.C. team which is 1-0 in the round-robin portion of the championships following a 19-18 victory over Windsor South Sunday night.

"She's our motivation out there," Darby said. "This is the best thing to ever happen for Layritz ever," the 12-year-old decided after the win. Both sides were plagued by walks - 16 issued to Windsor South and 17 to Layritz.

South came from behind to take an 18-16 lead into the sixth inning but couldn't hold it.

"TODAY THEY really tried to come back. They never seem to give up out there," South manager Gail Bowden said. "I think maybe they're almost trying too hard. They're trying to please everybody (in the stands). Now (at 0-2) they've got nothing to lose so maybe they'll loosen up for Tuesday's game."

League merger a boon

The passing of the Essex County Girls' Fastball League has led to a rebirth of the Windsor Wildcats League this summer.

The county league, for players 20 years and under, has joined forces with the Windsor league this year, giving it four A division teams and 11 B division teams.

"The idea is we can, hopefully in years to come, have some of these successful county teams move into the A division," said Jim Stonehouse, the league's president.

All the county teams went into the B division for this season but a couple
— including McGregor — are knock-

ing on the door of A.

"McGregor has six or seven players who could play in the A division," said veteran umpire Gerry Mayea. "What most of the B division teams need is a pitcher but I'm really impressed with the quality of the ball. They're mostly young kids but they know how to play. What's going to happen is they are going to make the A division better."

In the years before the merger, Mayea had watched the Windsor league's B division deteriorate "into a

garbage league.

"That's what we were worried about with this league but the level of play is so much better and the coaching is so much better than it used to

really well," she said.

All the B division teams make the playoffs because it's designed to be a developmental league for the younger players.

The two divisions do not interlock but instead crown separate champions.

Stonehouse said the Wildcats' organization had been after the Essex County league for the past few years to join them.
