



Wildcats face Olympian task

Area players wonder how they'll react to pitching

Three area softball players will rub shoulders with some Olympians tonight in Kitchener as they help members of Canada's softball team prepare for the Atlanta Games.

Colleen Caplin, Amber Staudt and Angie Zappacosta will play for the Ontario all-stars against Canada's national softball team. Then the Canadian squad will take on Japan in the second game of a doubleheader staged as part of pre-Olympic preparations

Caplin, Staudt and Zappacosta are members of the Windsor Wildcats, managed by Paul Layfield and coached by Eric Malcolm.

"I'm kinda nervous," Caplin said Tuesday. "Not so much about the crowd and the excitement, but more about facing an Olympic-calibre pitcher. We've never faced anybody who throws that hard and I'm half looking forward to it and half dreading it."

Caplin is a centre-fielder, Staudt plays right

field and Zappacosta plays second base and shortstop.

All three were selected based on their performances at various tournaments and recommendations from their coaches.

"We've been guaranteed three innings so we'll all get a chance to play, which should be really exciting," said Zappacosta.

"And I'm like Colleen, I'm nervous about facing the pitching because the calibre will be incredible.

"But it'll be a great experience to be on the field with players that good."

Over the weekend, the Canadian team warmed up with a doubleheader in Brampton where they defeated a local all-star team 6-0 and then knocked off Japan 2-0.

Japan is one of seven teams Canada will be facing in Atlanta, the others being the United States, China, Australia, Chinese Taipei, Puerto Rico and the Netherlands.

Canada is seeded fourth behind the U.S., China and Australia.

Earlier this summer, Canada, won a 16-team tournament in Surrey, B.C.

This marks the first Olympics in which softball will be a full medal sport.

Wildcats are winners Three local players did their part for Canada's Olympic softball preparations Wednesday night in Kitchener.

Colleen Caplin, Angie Zappacosta and Amber Staudt of the Windsor Wildcats all saw action for the Ontario All-Stars in a 10-0 loss to the Canad-

ian national team. Canadian pitcher Debbie Sonnenberg threw a one-hitter, allowing only one baserunner.

Zappacosta and Staudt each played four innings, at second base and in right field, respectively, and Caplin played two innings in right field. In the second game of the doubleheader at Woodside Park in front of 2,000 spectators, Japan edged Canada 1-0.

Local teams set pace at softball championships




