Villanova takes fastball title The Villanova Wildcats won the Detroit Catholic Girls A/B Fastball League championship with a 4-2 victory over Farmington Hills Mercy Monday. Kelly Bondy drove in three runs off a two-run, second-inning single and a ground out and Diane St. Germain had a double, triple and one REI. Leadoff hitter Amanda Deneau hit a pair of triples and scored a run. Erin Lambros was the winning pitcher. The Wildcats, who went 19-3 overall, have been in the league for five years but this marked their first championship.

Lady Wildcats Not to be outdone, Villanova's girls' fastball team also reaped several individual honours after taking its first Detroit Catholic League AA Fastball League title in five years.

Four Wildcats earned all-league honours and three went on to be named all-catholic.

"We've got a Grade 9 and Grade 10 pitcher and a Grade 9 catcher," manager Kirk Hayes said. "This team will be strong for another three years."

Pitcher Dianne St. Germain was named all-league after posting a 7-1 record with three saves and a 2.25 ERA. She also led the team with a .480 batting average and a .527 on-base percentage.

Joining her on the all-league team and also named allcatholic was first baseman Sara LeBlanc, centre-fielder Kelly Bondy and left-fielder Krista Dunn.

LeBlanc hit .353 and led the team with 11 steals. Bondy hit .283 and Dunn .408.

Shortstop Heather Owen, who hit .378, was named to the all-academic team while third baseman Kelly Fazekas and pitcher Erin Lambros earned all-league honorable mention.

Consolation title Katherine Weinz allowed just six hits over two complete games in the medal round as the Windsor Lady Expos novice II fastball team won the consolation championship of the Richmond, Mich. tournament on the weekend.

Therapeutic pursuit

Canadian softball team counts on Meloche at Summer Games

racy Meloche had the TV on, watching women's softball at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta.

As the camera panned the dugout of the Canadian team, Meloche spled her friend and colleague, serving as their athletic therapist.

"I knew he worked with the national team but I didn't really think about it when I put on the TV." Meloche said.

"It was the first year softball was at the Olympics and I thought to myself, I'd love to be there with the sport that I love."

She'll get that chance as the therapist for the women's national team competing at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney Australia.

A 30-year-old Essex native, Meloche can hardly wait to leave.

Exactly what to take is proving to be one of her biggest challenges.

Requests for Olympic souvenirs have been pouring in from family and friends since Meloche found out she was going.

"I'm trying to keep my suitcase pretty empty on the way over," she said, with a laugh.

She's already brought one load of memorabilia back from a pre-Olympic tournament held by the host country last April.

A graduate of Essex District Secondary School, Meloche played soccer, volleyball and badminton for the Red Raiders. She used to be an infielder in

the Windsor/Essex County fastball league.

Meloche went on to get her diploma in sport injury management from Sheridan Community College.

She's been working as an athletic therapist since 1991, most recently on staff at York University.

A friend and former classmate hooked up with the national softball program years ago and offered Meloche's name when the junior team needed a therapist.

"I had one week's notice to make a trip with them to Taiwan," Meloche said.

Upon return, she was offered the chance at several assignments with the senior team, which was interested in adding a second therapist to its program. She was part of a competition in San Diego last fall and the Australian tour-

nament this spring.
Finally, in May, Softball Canada extended an Olympic invitation.

"It's speeding up on me but I'm feeling pretty darn good about it." Meloche said.

"I've been told it's typically 16-hour days. I'm basically the first one up and the last one to bed."

The health of 15 players is her domain. She gets everything ready before the team arrives at the diamond for a morning practice, does all the taping of ankles, fingers or wrists and she hangs around the back stop in case of injury and follows up with treatments afterwards.

"This group has been relatively injury free so far," she said.

"These players are older and they know their bodies better than I know their bodies. Basically, when it comes to playing or not, it's a three-way decision between me, the coach and the player, but I have the ultimate sax"


