"For the last few years, we've been able to shut other teams down but we haven't been able to put any runs up ourselves." Stamatiadis said.

"I think we can do that this year. We haven't had a team this balanced and

strong in three years."

The Lancers open the 2008 season in the Ontario Intercollegiate Women's Fastball Association with a Saturday doubleheader against Ottawa (2 and 4 p.m.) and a Sunday twinbill against Carleton (noon, 2 p.m.) at Windsor Stadium.

Six members of the team are fresh from a successful summer with the Windsor Lady Expos who took silver at the Ontario junior championships.

Melissa Bowyer was named the tournament's top pitcher for a stingy 1.20 ERA. Her crossover teammates include outfield er Carly Erina, first baseman Jacqueline Liffiton, outfielder Michelle Maynard, catcher Lyndsay Shincariol and outfielder Kaitlyn Brehm.

Leadoff hitter

Liffiton and Shincariol were 2007 OIW-FA all-stars. Leadoff hitter and left-fielder Katie Facecchia was a 2006 all-star.

Maynard is moving from second to centre this fall while newcomer Haley Ostrowski, of Mississauga, takes over her former infield position. Another promising newcomer from Mississauga is rightfielder Stephanie Manson.

"We've got a good crop from the Toronto area," Stamatiadis said.

"With what we've got back plus our new additions, we're totally excited about this season."

The Lancers qualified as a low seed for the 2007 championship tournament where they dropped all three games.

They're hoping to be more of a factor in 2008.
