## Lumley opened doors for young athletes

#### Dinner to salute Herman coach

Before O.J. Atogwe went on to star in the National Football League, before Mary Spencer became a two-time world boxing champion, they had a teacher at Herman who believed in them.

"Other than God and my family, Mr. Lumley played the largest role in my getting a scholarship to Stanford," said Atogwe of Harry Lumley, who retired from teaching earlier this year.

Now living in St. Louis and starting for the Rams, Atogwe will be back in Windsor to attend a dinner in Lumley's honour June 13 at the the Junction, 1200 University Ave.

Tickets are \$20 in advance and \$25 at the door Tickets are available at Herman, The Penalty Box and Lumley Chiropractic.

"He has a heart that takes in everybody, even if he doesn't know you that well," Atogwe said. "He just tries to put you in a position where you can do the best for yourself."

When Spencer decided to take up boxing as a senior at Herman, she asked Lumley to help arrange a schedule that allowed her to train each morning.

"He didn't owe me any favours," Spencer said.

"I told him I wanted to become a Canadian champion so I could have the opportunity to compete at the world championships and if I could medal there, I would get my schooling paid for, which would be the only way I could go to university."

## Lumley influenced countless athletes

"It was a far-fetched goal to have but I knew then that Harry believed in me," Spencer said.

"Most people that I've known since I began boxing know me as an athlete who is dedicated 100 per cent.

"It's easy to convince them that I want to be one of the first women in history to win a gold medal in boxing in the Olympics.

But Harry knew me before all of this, when I didn't give 100 per cent to anything and be believed in me regardless."

As a teacher, guidance counselor and a coach of baseball. foothall and soccer, Lumley has been influencing the lives of teenagers like Atogwe and Spencer for more than 40 years.

He started coaching baseball as a teenager himself when his own team couldn't find anyone else to do it. He went on to win a Canadian juvenile championship as coach of the Mic Macs.

In high school football, Lamley-coached teams have reached the finals 22 times, winning far more than they lost.

"He has an absolutely outstanding offensive mind," said Godfrey Janisse, who coached Lumley as a student at Herman and went on to coach with Lumley for almost 30 years.

But beyond his success on the gridiron, Janisse calls Lumley a rainmaker.

"His ability to work with people and get things done program wise, is incredible," Jamisse said.

"Harry provides a situation where there's a lot of opportunities for the kids. These kids are his whole life and he makes these things happen for them."

As far as Lumley is concerned, he's just paying forward the help he got from Janisse when he was a kid without much direction.

"Three kids on my block went to Kingston Penitentiary," Lumley said. "Godfrey was the one who saved my tail in high school."

Lumley plans to continue coach at Herman, where each year, he gives a season-ending speech to his players encouraging them to remember their high school as they move on with their lives.

"We always tell them, if you can ever help your high school in some way, do it," he said.

"If it's time, give them some time, if you've got money, give money."


