Assistant coaches add experience

A couple of varsity teams with the St. Clair Saints picked up valuable experience on the bench in the naming of basketball's Royal Church and fastball's Doug Wiseman as assistant coaches.

"We're fortunate to have

them in terms of the experience they bring to their respective sports," said Ted Beale, an athletic co-ordinator for the college.

"The strength of the total coaching staff includes the assistant coaches. It's more of a football arrangement these days where you need someone to run the offence and someone for the defence.

Their provincial bronze medal earned in the fall of 2011 represented their seventh consecutive OCAA medal.

When Humber dispatched the Saints, 12-7 in the semifinals, it marked the first time since 2007 that St. Clairdidn't challenge Durham College for OCAA gold.

"I want to be competitive," Wiseman said. "I'm looking forward to this. It's a good opportunity for me."

Wiseman coached in the

Windsor Wildcats' system for six seasons before forming the Windsor Wild Ladies Intermediate team in 2010. He continues to coach that team this summer.

Wiseman also developed the Villanova Wildcats' high school slo-pitch program into a champion with four consecutive WECSSAA titles.

He stepped down as Villanova's coach a few years ago.

"I have a little more time now," Wiseman said. "I'm just looking to help out wherever I can."

Church has been coaching basketball at various levels for 40 years, including an interim season as head coach of the Windsor Lancer women.

"It was just time for a change," he said of a decision to join the staff of friend and fellow veteran coach Ken Ambrose at St. Clair after coaching in the Windsor Valiants' travel system much of the past decade.

The Saints are looking to recreate the success they enjoyed under former head coach Jimmy Parsons but Ambrose endured an injury-plagued first season that ended with a disappointing 5-13 record.

into the program," Church said.

"He's a good guy and he cares. We have a philosophy and a vision that could quickly turn that record around to 13-5." "The new facility is a tremendous recruiting tool," Church said. "We're going to start drawing better players."


Also at the tournament, the Windsor Lady Expos won a bronze medal and are also advancing to the national championships.

"After the way we played against Seneca, I think we can accomplish anything." the 18-year-old Assumption grad


