duced as the successor to program founder Bill Smith, who stepped down in May after 11 seasons that featured a run of eight consecutive OCAA medals, including back-to-back gold medals. Wiseman joined Smith's staff last season and, after getting the call last Friday that the head job was his, he quickly signed on veteran coaches Mike Sikora and Jim Stonehouse to join holdover assistant Kelli Paquette on his staff.

"It's a great mix," Wiseman said. "It's a real comfort zone for me. These two guys were my top choices.


