Georgiou pitched five scoreless innings to record the win and improve to 2-1.



Bondy does double duty with St. Clair teams

Saints off to Calgary for softball tourney

On any given day, Sarah Bondy has three backpacks slung over her shoulder.

"One's for softball, one's for basketball and one's for school," the 19-year-old two-sport star for the St. Clair Saints said.

Bondy is doing double duty for the Saints again this fall, as a starting second baseman and leadoff hitter for the fastball team and as a guard with the basketball team.

She was in London Tuesday night with the fastball team, posting an 11-3 win over the Fanshawe Falcons and wrapping up first place in the OCAA with a 14-4 record.

The team flies out for Calgary Thursday and the Canadian Collegiate Softball Association championships.

As for basketball, that team opened its pre-season on the road on the weekend with a tournament in Oshawa.

"It's a little crazy from time to time," Bondy said. "Mainly you have to be focused and you have to set time aside. I learned last year that planners are a good thing. My car is a mess but my life is organized."

The overlap continues for several more weeks since the Saints are hosting the OCAA fastball championships Oct. 17-18, four days before the OCAA basketball regular season begins.

Bondy did the same crazy double dip last year as a freshman in the protection, security and investigations program.

"When I started (school) last year, they asked me what (sport) I was going to do and I said I don't know yet," she said.

"Softball started a bit early so I went out for that and realized

how much I loved it. The same thing happened with basketball so I decided I'm going to stick it out and do both. Not many people can do it. I'm thrilled and blessed that I can pull it off."

She does class assignments on the bus and emails her work to understanding instructors.

There are times when she changes workout clothes in her car at the side of the road as she hustles from the diamond to the gym. Sometimes, she has to choose which practice she can make and which she can't.

That's required some compromises between Saints fastball coach Doug Wiseman and basketball's Andy Kiss.

"They're both very understanding but they both don't give me any slack," Bondy said.

They let me go day by day with what I need to do."

Bondy is near the top in several statistical categories for fastball. She's first in the OCAA in doubles (10), third in slugging percentage (.700) third in on base percentage (.500) and top five in batting (.467).

"I'm glad she's on our team," Wiseman said. "She works hard at making both sports work along with maintaining her academics."


