



The Windsor Wildcat ladies intermediate fastball team won a silver medal at a provincial championship on the weekend in Windsor.


The Wildcats lost 3-2 in nine innings to Chepstow.

managing stalwart Kaschak dies at 83

Windsor's baseball community has lost one of its longtime stalwarts with the passing of former manager Bill (Biggie) Kaschak.

Kaschak died of an apparent heart attack at his home on Friday. He was 83.

Kaschak managed the last Windsor team to appear at the Little League World Series, the Windsor South Canadians, in Williamsport, Pa., in 1972. Kaschak's son Bill Jr. played first base on that team, which finished sixth in the tournament.

"He wasn't a great player but he developed a fondness for managing teams and he never stopped managing for almost 50 years," said Kaschak of his father.

Born in Winnipeg, Kaschak moved to Windsor with his family when he was eight. He first became known as a soccer player at Kennedy Collegiate.

Kaschak played on many local teams before switching to managing fastball teams. The 1972 club was, in fact, the first hardball team he managed.

"He loved managing," Kaschak said. "He loved strategic moves, bunting, stealing, he liked to be in control of the game. He was a very smart manager."

Kaschak said his father was also deeply proud of the Metro

Catering fastball teams he managed in the 1990s. "We won five city championships that decade so he was very proud of that team," Kaschak said.

Kaschak owned several confectionary stores, including Matthews Confectionery in Riverside. He later became a distributor for the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corp. before retiring in 1992.

Visitation for Kaschak will be held Wednesday from 3-5 and 7-9 p.m. at the Windsor Chapel Funeral Home at 1700 Tecumseh Rd. E.

The funeral service will be Thursday at 11 a.m. in the chapel.


